Our Week at a Glance



¹ For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven: ... a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing...

We live in extraordinary times. Even so, as unique as our circumstances may feel, as perilous or unsettling or anxious as the news we hear may be, it behooves us to remain calm and remember that throughout the course of human history societies and communities have survived and even thrived during just such times. Crisis like our present circumstances can evoke the best and the worst in our human nature. We can turn inward and let fear, uncertainty and worry consume us, or we can reach beyond ourselves and find purpose, strength, comfort and hope.

The single most important aspect of thriving during crisis is binding yourself to something more substantial than oneself. Those of whose identities are rooted in Baptism are especially blessed because Christ has grafted us into the life and work of the Living God. Our attachment to God can be strengthened in two profoundly important ways.

First, God's holy Word offers us guidance and comfort, but it does more than provide us with strategies and perspective. Reading Scripture grafts our lives onto the more resilient life of God's people, past and present. In times like these narratives relating how God's people have enduring harrowing challenges are particularly helpful (e.g. Joseph's story Gen 37-50, Exodus, Ruth, Esther, Daniel, or Paul's letters written from prison – Ephesians, Colossians, Philippiuans and *Philemon*). Beyond these consider reading Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John again. Reading Scripture devotionally brings with it the presence of the Holy Spirit, which fills us with an awareness of God's presence in our lives and our troubled world. Undertaking an intentional time of devotional reading offers us an anchor in uncertain times from which all of us

can surely benefit.

Another critical element in grounding ourselves in God's presence involves acknowledging that we, individually, are part of the larger Body of Christ in the world. St. Paul tells us in 1 Corinthians 12: For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. ¹³ For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free – and we were all made to drink of one Spirit. ¹⁴ Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many.

Even though we are not able to physically gather together to worship on Sundays, we can still connect with each other, drawing strength from one another. When we think of someone in the congregation during the course of our day, consider it a prompting of the Holy Spirit, and take the opportunity to reach out to that person. We are fortunate that we have many ways to electronically reach out to others, but hearing another person's voice brings the greatest comfort.

Confined more than usual to our homes, let us take this opportunity to strengthen the bonds of our community of faith, nurture mutual love for one another, and deepen our relationship with our Father through prayer and Scripture reading.
