Growing Crops or Weeds While Working in God's Garden

"The Lord God took the man and put him in the garden of Eden to till it and keep it." From the very beginning, we find God partners with man to work the land – to till it, to plant in it, to fertilize it, to care for the budding crops, to water them, to harvest, and to eat of the produce. Throughout the scripture, farming and agricultural references abound, with discussions about how the growing of crops is like our growth of faith.

Jesus said: "The kingdom of God is as if someone would scatter seed on the ground and would sleep and rise night and day, and the seed would sprout and grow, he does not know how. The earth produces of itself...." That mysterious seed, with its creative strength, allows for human needs. However, if the farmer does not plant the seed, till the soil, water it, or fertilize it, the plant may not reach full maturity.

So it is with our faith. Do we plant 'seeds of faith' or 'seeds of doubt'? Do we allow the seeds to nurture with pure water or impure water? The types of seeds we plant in our hearts are important. We can also plant new bits of understanding by studying the Scripture. In so doing, may our faith continue to grow.

It's no wonder that Scripture encourages us to look to the farmer as an example. When Paul tells Timothy to be strong in the grace of Christ, he points specifically toward the hardworking farmer (2 Timothy 2:6). When he exhorts the Galatian churches toward endurance, he speaks of perennial planting and patient waiting for an inevitable harvest. (Galatians 6:9).

As God's stewards on this little planet earth, continue to ponder the relationship of our faith and the daily work of farmers. If you do not have a small garden plot, or even flower beds to work in, consider joining with other church members in working in our community garden. Digging, planting, and working in the soil, and watching the vegetable growth from the efforts can be a constant reminder of how our faith can and should be nurtured.
