Mortgage Update

Greetings all from the Mortgage Reduction Task Force. Thank you for your efforts to pay down Spanaway Lutheran's mortgage! Recently Pastor shared with the congregation that we are on track to pay off our mortgage by January of 2022.

When we started this endeavor last year the pay off amount of our loan was \$489,000. Our goal was to have our mortgage paid off in time for our congregation's 60th anniversary in the summer of 2022. Our plan to meet this goal is to keep making our monthly mortgage payment and come up with an additional \$300,000 towards the principal of our mortgage.

There are now 3 different dollar amounts being shared in the Lamplighter for the Mortgage Update. The first is the amount received for the week listed. The second is the total amount received to date. The third amount reflects the pay off amount of our mortgage. This means we have now saved ourselves around \$214,000 of interest on Spanaway Lutheran's mortgage. Wow!

Know that each and every one of your efforts are making a difference. Wouldn't it be wonderful to reach the half way point of \$150,000 by the end of the year? It's never too late to join in. No amount is too small and every little bit helps towards our goal. Thank you for your efforts.

Pastor's Evaluation Completed

The SLC Personnel Committee, utilizing considerable input from many sources, has just completed a formal evaluation of Pastor Schier Hanson.

The method used was an increasingly popular form of job performance assessment know as a "Three Sixty", or a 360° view of the employee's work. This is accomplished by including in the evaluation not just the pastor's "supervisors", as in the council, or just the Spanaway Lutheran Personnel Committee, but a cross-sectional representation of the entire congregation selected for the diversity of its age, length of membership, gender and roles in the church. The interviews also included the Bishop of the ELCA's SW Washington Synod. Those interviewed regarding Pastor's performance included 23 members of the congregation including representation from the church council and several members pastor suggested who he felt were especially conversant in particular areas of his work. This particular method of evaluation is in keeping with the congregationally mandated strategies of "Clear Communication" and "Every Member Engagement".

As with most evaluations, areas were identified where Pastor is doing just fine, others where he is excelling and a few that need improvement. The Pastor and council have been briefed on the outcome and the Personnel Committee is working on a plan to strengthen and preserve areas of accomplishment and to improve areas needing attention. This "plan" will be implemented, monitored and adjusted as necessary over the next two years for the desired results.

Many thanks to the members who provided their valuable input into the results and to the Personnel Committee for conducting the process. Due to the complexity and time it takes to complete this type of process, it is not planned to be repeated at this level of detail for up to four years. Thanks again to everyone who contributed to making this an informative and successful evaluation.
