MARTIN CARES CITIZENS ACADEMY AND RESOURCE EDUCATION SERIES

The Martin County Board of County Commissioners is pleased to invite you to participate in an exciting, innovative program designed to give residents an insider's look into Martin County government. It is called Martin CARES, the Citizens Academy and Resource Education Series.

This popular, long running program has been invigorated with a new twist. Sessions focus on themes including Martin County 101; Planes, Drains and Automobiles; Meet our Everyday Heroes; Improving and Informing our Communities; and Explore our Paradise and Beyond. Participants will hear interactive presentations from various County departments and enjoy unique field trips. Visit the water treatment plant, ride the runway at the airport, watch 911 dispatchers in action, tour historic treasures, explore parks and get an up close look at a water quality project. Not a bad way to spend the day!

The goal is to familiarize residents with the function and purpose of Martin County government, thus increasing citizen awareness of the variety of services offered by local government. Through Martin CARES, participants will personally get to know the men and women who oversee the day-to-day operation of the departments that provide key services such as roads, water and sewer service, parks, emergency medical services and law enforcement. Upon completion of the program, participants will have first-hand knowledge of the structure and function of County government and can share that information with friends and neighbors.

Each "class" is comprised of approximately 50 citizens (spouses welcome) participating in a series of sessions held once a week over a five-week period. Classes begin at 8:00 am and conclude following a "working" lunch. There is no

charge to participate in this program and meals will be provided. Air-conditioned coach transportation is provided for adventures in the field.

Two sessions are held each fiscal year. Editor Libby is signed up for the second session beginning February 22. Classes will start up again in January 2019. This program has been named by Stuart Magazine as a New Year's Bucket List "must-do!"
