Membership in the Bulldog Club of Utah has its duties and requirements. We are a club formed to educate people about the Bulldog breed, to encourage responsible pet ownership, and provide a support network for Bulldog owners.

We discourage indiscriminate breeding of dogs. Ours is a difficult breed and one that requires study and thought before producing puppies. We expect our members to be judicious in their breeding programs and only breed with the betterment of Bulldogs as their chief priority. Temperament and health are paramount in our breed. They should be the first consideration of the breeder

We are governed by the rules and regulations of the American Kennel Club and the Bulldog Club of America. Their codes of ethics and sportsmanship are ours.

The members of the Bulldog Club of Utah are anxious and happy to provide new owners with information about health and training. While many us are involved in showing our dogs, we are pet owners first. Conformation, Obedience, Agility, Rally, and Tracking are all suitable endeavors for Bulldogs (some more than others). The challenge is to the owner. The club encourages you to "Do Something with Your Dog", even if it is just to sit on the couch or go for a walk. We try to have events which include the dog and his family.

But, the club needs your participation. If you do not believe you can be a participant at meetings and other club functions on <u>a regular basis</u>, please consider joining the club as a "Friend". As a "Friend" you will receive the newsletter, generally published monthly and will be notified of any upcoming events which we encourage you to attend whenever possible. A "Friend" may not hold office or vote.

You will need to have a member of the club act as your sponsor if you wish to join. Code of Ethics

Members of the Bulldog Club of Utah have an obligation to protect the welfare and best interest of their breed by conducting themselves in a manner designed to reflect credit to themselves, their breed, and the Bulldog Club of Utah.

Members who exhibit are expected to observe the highest standard of sportsmanship, conduct themselves in such a manner as to reflect positively on the sport of showing dogs, and exhibit good will at all shows and obedience trials.

Members who contemplate breeding a litter, or who allow the use of their stud dog for the same purpose, shall direct their efforts toward producing dogs of quality, of even temperament, vigorous, and free of health problems. They shall be familiar with the Bulldog breed and its BCA/AKC approved standard and breed only those specimens which conform to it.

Members shall not engage in false or misleading advertising or misrepresentation of their breed, nor shall they malign their competition by making false or misleading statements regarding their competitors' dogs, breeding practices or person.

Blatant disregard for the standards set out in this code shall be considered unacceptable behavior and not supported by the Bulldog Club of Utah.

By signing and submitting this application for membership consideration, the applicant authorizes and agrees to hold harmless and without liability the BCU, its officers, and its members to investigate, solicit, obtain, and discuss any and all information pertaining to an applicant's moral and ethical character as it relates to the standards and guidelines set forth by the BCU and which is believed by the BCU, its officers and its members to have a bearing upon the applicants moral and ethical character. Applicant acknowledges that all information gathered shall be open for review and discussion among the BCU, its officers, and its members as part of the BCU membership application process.



Bulldog Club of Utah Code of Ethics

Members of the Bulldog Club of Utah have an obligation to protect the welfare and best interest of their breed by conducting themselves in a manner designed to reflect credit to themselves, their breed, and the Bulldog Club of Utah.

Members shall assist in the goal that no Bulldog ever be surrendered to a humane society or shelter. Members will take all appropriate measures to assist a Bulldog in distress.

Members who exhibit are expected to observe the highest standard of sportsmanship in accordance with the AKC Code of Sportsmanship and conduct themselves in such a manner as to reflect positively on the sport of showing dogs, and exhibit good will at all shows and obedience trials.

Members who contemplate breeding a litter, or who allow the use of their stud dog for the same purpose, shall direct their efforts toward producing dogs of quality, of even temperament, vigorous, and free of health problems. They shall be familiar with the Bulldog breed and its BCA/AKC approved standard of excellence and breed only those specimens which conform to it. Bitches should only be bred once a year. They should not be bred before 18 months of age, after 7 years of age nor after 3 whelping's.

Members shall not engage in false or misleading advertising or misrepresentation of their breed, nor shall they malign their competition by making false or misleading statements regarding their competitors' dogs, breeding practices or person. All advertising shall be factual and not slanted to attract undesirable buyers or encourage the raising of Bulldogs as a money making business.

Members shall not display the BCU logo on websites where puppies are listed for sale unless the website belongs to a BCA Breeder Referral Member in good standing.

Blatant disregard for the standards set out in this code shall be considered unacceptable behavior and not supported by the Bulldog Club of Utah. Members whose actions are detrimental to the breed, to the club and to AKC shall be asked to resign.
