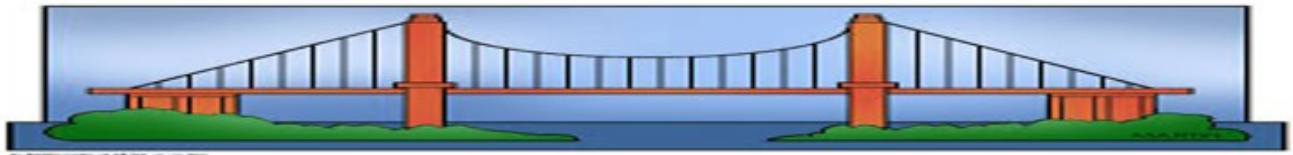

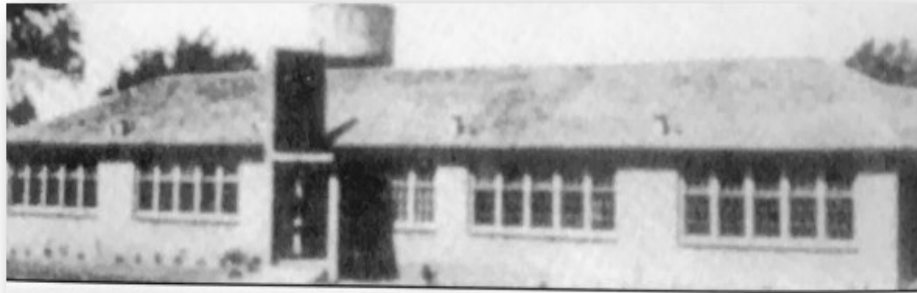

## History of the George Washington Carver Schools

By 1864 in Grimes County, according to county tax rolls, war refugees had swollen the local slave population to 7,005. While some blacks entering the county under these circumstances would after the war return to the communities from which they had been recently uprooted, many more would stay to build a new life in Grimes County.

Shortly after the ***Emancipation Proclamation***, to assist the county's large population of freedmen in their transition to citizenship, an office of the ***Freedmen's Bureau*** was established in June 1866. Most of Grimes County was placed within the Bureau's Twentieth Subdistrict, which was variously headquartered in Courtney, Navasota, Millican, Anderson, and, finally, in Bryan in Brazos County. The Freedmen's Bureau established a court system to dispense justice to the former slaves and protected the freedmen in their exercise of the franchise and supervised the signing of labor contracts.

Camp Addition and Camp Subdivision in Navasota were sold to white settlers, but a part of the town which Ira Malcolm Camp named Canaan Town was sold to freed men who changed the name to Freedmen Town. These brave Freed men and Freed women with support from the Freedmen's Bureau, purchased and developed settlements. Many of the first educational institutions for African Americans established in the county were created during these years by the Freedmen's Bureau, which founded schools in Courtney, Anderson, and Navasota. George Washington Carver was built in one such community, Ira Malcom Camp's Canaan Town.

Navasota Freedmen Reverend Jerry J. Reinhardt, also a Trustee of the Baptist Denomination, purchased land from Ira Malcolm Camp in South Navasota on March 4, 1869. The next year on June 17, 1870, Reinhardt and fellow Trustees James Hampshire and Allen Lattimore of the Baptist Denomination sold part of the land to the Freedmen School Trustees to build a school for the children of the newly freed men. The property for the school was purchased by the Freedmen School Trustees led by Jackson Neighbours, Manson Reese, Lawson Vaughn, Wilson Owens, and Robert Atkins. The school now known as George Washington Carver shares historic Freedman Town with [the African American Methodist Church, Lee Tabernacle Methodist Church, and early Missionary Baptist Churches- Friendship Missionary Baptist Church and True Vine Missionary Baptist Church of Navasota.](#)

The earliest public school for African Americans was taught by white men from the North. Mrs. O'Hair was one of the first teachers at The Colored School. Some classes were held in Gibbs Store in downtown Navasota and some in the Methodist church which at that time was near the present site of the school. Each student who attended the school paid a \$1.00 fee per month and \$.25 for a speller (Grimes County Historical Commission, 2008). The schools operated with practically no equipment.

With the leadership and influence of the Reverend J.J. Reinhart and Reverend L.L. Gamble, circa 1870, Professor James Washington from Chicago, Illinois, became the first principal of Navasota Colored School. During his administration, Mr. Malcolm Camp gave the land on South LaSalle Street where a permanent school could be built. About 1875, the government built a one room frame school on that site. The State Board of Education made no provisions for maintenance of The Colored School until after the adoption of The Constitution of 1876.

Professor Robert J. Evans (Exhibit L) succeeded Professor Washington as principal in 1878. Evans, also a state representative, remained principal until 1884 (Hales, 2010). His wife, Mrs. Mary Evans, served as principal until 1886.

From 1887 to 1889, Professor J. D. Hill served as principal and his wife, Mary Hill, was one of the teachers at The Colored School. Students could enroll in Navasota Colored School at the age of eight. The school was not graded during Professor Hill's tenure. Other members of the faculty were: Susie Jones, Ellen McLewis, Lillie Muldrew and Ira Reese, Sr. Two students, Tommie Smith and Henry Woods served as teacher assistants.

Professor W.O. Landry succeeded Professor J.D. Hill as principal in 1890. His faculty members were: J.M. Codwell, Annie Simpson, Maude Smith, and Patsy Codwell. The school became graded during his administration. The school continued to grow, and algebra was added to the curriculum. It was during Professor Landry's tenure that the first Navasota Colored School building burned to the ground. Classes were held in various places while the school was being rebuilt. After Professor Landry's death in 1896, T.M. Fairchild became principal. Professor Fairchild served two years as principal of Navasota Colored School until 1889.

In 1898, Professor A.E. McMillian became principal. During his administration, on August 16, 1910, the school burned again. School was held in both True Vine and Friendship Baptist Churches and the Odd Fellows Hall. Later, a new brick building with a library was erected on the same site. The student enrollment increased and a total of sixteen teachers were on the faculty. The first baccalaureate program was held in 1910 and the first baccalaureate sermon was delivered at that time by David Abner, Jr. of Conroe, Texas. Mr. Abner had served as president of both Guadalupe College and Conroe College. Professor McMillian was principal of Navasota Colored School until 1914.

Professor J.G. Osborne succeeded Professor McMillian and served from 1914 to 1916. The school continued to progress during his tenure.

Mr. I.A. Reece succeeded Professor Osborne and served two years as principal: 1916 – 1918.

Mr. W.E. Jones was appointed principal after Mr. Reece left. Professor Jones and his wife, who was the Home Economics teacher, were highly respected by the students and the community. A few of the teachers on staff were: Mr. O'Neal, Georgia Cole, Elnora Scales, Fannie Reece and Fannie Bryant. The school was well known for its outstanding debate team and orator Thomas W. Cole, Sr. who graduated in 1930. Cole went on to become the first African American to receive a doctorate from the University of Texas at Austin. During his career, he served as the President of Wiley College and Dean of Academic Affairs/University Ombudsman at the University of Florida (Cole, 2005). John Galvan, another student, became one of America's Buffalo Soldiers.

On March 2, 1923, the first Manual Training Building was erected. On August 27, 1928, the Rosenwald Foundation contributed \$1,000 towards a four-room building for the Home Economics and Manual Training Departments. On February 5, 1929, the administration applied for and received state and federal aid for the Home Economics teacher's salary. Professor Jones was principal of The Colored School for nineteen years until 1937.

On July 13, 1937, M.W. Evans was elected principal of Navasota Colored School. Mr. Evans was the administrator who added Negro History to the curriculum. The students were required to purchase their own Black History textbook. Professor Evans was principal for only two years.

Professor Stroud, a coach and teacher, who came to Navasota from the state of Colorado, introduced tennis to the school and constructed the first tennis court for Navasota Colored High Students. Celestine Hatchett, President of the Senior Class of 1938, was the first Navasota Colored High female athlete to win the Class AAA Tennis Singles Competition held at Prairie View A&M College.

On June 6, 1940, Professor J.C. Madison replaced Professor Evans. During his administration, the school continued to move forward. The first band was organized, and the first cafeteria was opened with Mrs. McAdoo as head cook and manager. The dishes and flatware were donated by parents and people in the community. It was during Professor Madison's tenure that Navasota Colored School was named George Washington Carver High School. A student, Katherine Tapscott Jones, wrote the award-winning essay entitled, "Why Navasota Colored School Should be Named George Washington Carver High School." The essay was written in 1942 and the name was officially changed a few years later. Also Dr. E.T. Ketchum donated land for a playground site on State Highway 105 at South LaSalle Street (Exhibit G).

In 1947, Professor J.H. Payne was appointed principal of Carver High School. During his tenure, the school grew tremendously. There were eight buses transporting students to the school daily. A new auditorium-gymnasium was built. The old elementary school was renovated. A new high school was built in 1942 with facilities for a science laboratory, a library, a typing room and a fully equipped lunchroom (McDaniel, 1962) (Exhibit B). Stewart Field was purchased for outdoor sports (Exhibit H). New audio-visual equipment was purchased. Carver became a four-year accredited high school with an updated curriculum which met the state guidelines.

In the mid-fifties, Mrs. Dorelia A. "Mama" Jarvis wrote the words and Mrs. Melvia Wrenn Mitchell wrote the music for the school Alma Mater (Exhibit P).

Between 1947 and 1954, the school's enrollment more than tripled itself. The increase was due to the consolidation of some area schools with the Navasota school district. From 1949 to 1954, the following schools became a part of the Navasota school system: Freeman School in 1949, Colored School of Eureka in 1950, Courtney, Templeman Hill, Lynn Grove, Post Oak Springs, Chatam, Stoneham, Ervin-Piedmont and Plantersville all in 1951. A.M.T. School, Allen Farm became a part in 1955. As a result of the consolidation, the enrollment at Carver was approximately 1,000; there were 33 teachers, four vocational teachers, one visiting teacher, three elementary principals, one high school principal and one supervisor.

In the early 1950s, the auditorium-gymnasium which was located on the corner of LaSalle and Abraham was destroyed by fire. Later it was rebuilt on the south end of the Carver campus (Exhibit C).

From 1954 through 1964, G.W. Carver continued to grow and progress. In May of 1954, the Supreme Court ruled that the doctrine of separate but equal was unconstitutional. In the fall of 1964 desegregation of the schools in Navasota ISD started with the freedom of choice movement ("School Here to Comply with Federal Law," 1964). Desegregation began with the primary grades and eventually included the secondary grades. Students could choose to attend George Washington Carver High School or Navasota High School.

Mr. Woodrow Jackson was appointed principal in February 1968 due to the passing of Mr. J.H. Payne (Conkling, 1968). In May 1968, George Washington Carver High School graduated its final class.

In September of 1968, Navasota High School was fully integrated. Carver High School became an elementary school housing grades one through eight. Mr. Leo McGee was appointed principal of the elementary school. In May of 1970, the George Washington Carver campus closed. In September of that same year, the Carver campus served as the Navasota Junior High School housing grades seven and eight until November of 1974 when it was closed. The site was used by other agencies in the community, such as the Navasota Child Development Center, until 1996.

In August of 1996, the school reopened as the Carver Learning Center for Alternative Education. The Navasota Independent School district continued to utilize the campus in various capacities until it was deeded to the Navasota George Washington Carver High School Alumni Association, Inc. with the process being finalized in April of 2008. The alumni association, chartered in 1995 to provide scholarships and create interest in the alumni and ex-students of Carver and continues to use the facility which is now known as the Carver Community Center. The center is used to host tutorials, summer camp, and other events. It is also where the Texas Small Farmers and Ranchers Community Based Organization has an office and a community garden.

## NAVASOTA GEORGE WASHINGTON CARVER HIGH SCHOOL ALUMNI ASSOCIATION'S HISTORY

The Navasota George Washington Carver High School Alumni Association was a vision of numerous Carverites of Navasota. The first Carver School Reunion was given by three former students of G. W Carver High School: Dorothy Robinson, Mary Robinson and Shirley Webster, 1982, in Houston, Texas. The second Carver School Reunion was held in 1983, at Fireman's Hall Navasota. Texas.

In January 1984, members of the Grimes County Awareness League, under the leadership of Annie Johnson as president, organized the Carver School Reunion. This organization involved all schools that were formerly under the authority of the Navasota Independent School District. The goal of the organization was to aid in maintaining and improving the quality of education in the black community by aiding in the support of the Navasota Day Care Center and presenting a qualified student with a scholarship. This all occurred under the direction of Dorothy Sargent, chairperson, who was assisted by Eloise Brown, Nora Creeks. Helen Hammie, Ruby Hunter, and Annie Johnson.

Plans were made and executed for the G. W. Carver Reunion in June 1985. Former teachers were present at this event: Joyce Simmons Bowie (1955), Leo McGee (1934), Maxine Johns (1927), and Elizabeth Simmons (1921). A memorial for the deceased teachers was given by Lillian Willis Wesley (1958), at the night's activity. Percell Warren (1953) served as host and technician. Thelma Hunter Sparks (1946) pulled it all together with her contribution of the occasion. This organization hosted the reunion for the preceding nine years.

The Alumni Association we know today, as Navasota George Washington Carver Alumni Association, held its first meeting Saturday, June 26, 1993, in the conference room of the Navasota Child Development Center on the Carver campus. The first elected officers were: President — Ronald E. Franklin, Sr.; First Vice President — Arthur Arrington; Second Vice President — Lorealia Blanton; Recording Secretary — Dorothy N. Sargent; Corresponding Secretary — Frances Prater; Treasurer — Rosie Thompson; Chaplain — Madalyn M. Hunter. These officers were elected for a two-year term.

The purpose of the organization was to create interest in the field of alumni-ex-student relations, promote the development of the whole person (students) through scholarships and moral support. To further a lasting friendship among all ex-students and supporters of the former George Washington Carver High School and to promote the Navasota Child Development Center was the desire of this organization. The Association held its annual meeting each year in June, in conjunction with the mass reunion. The Executive Board met monthly in Navasota or Houston, Texas. Memberships were solicited to help continue a heritage of excellence of our dear old Alma Mater.

Under this organization, the first mass reunion was held June 24-26, 1994, at the Fireman's Hall. One scholarship was given, in the amount of \$1,000.00 to Melanie Watson and the first souvenir book was printed, Mildred Edwards — Chairperson, Mary Blackshear, and Charlye Cotton -- Co-Chairpersons. The annual dues were \$25.00 for membership and \$300.00 for life membership. Membership entitled each member to a membership card, admission to the reunion, program and Carver booklet, banquet and dance, zipper bag with goodies, and a floral arrangement or standing spray upon death of a member.

Because of the expense involved, it was decided that the membership for the Mass Reunion would be \$35.00. Membership entitled the members to a Friday night get acquainted gathering, Saturday; 6-7:00 A.M. walk-a-thon with coffee and social hour to follow, 10:00 A.M. annual Carver meeting, 11 :00 A.M. - 2:00 P.M., family picnic, 6:00 P.M. - Banquet, 9:00 P.M. - 2:00 A.M. Dance, Sunday - worship at a local church.

The Navasota George Washington Carver Alumni Association received its charter July 21, 1995, written by Michael Love, CPA. The Association was now incorporated by the State of Texas as a non-profit organization in the State of Texas. June 1996, we applied for and received an advanced ruling from the United States Treasury Department to become a tax-exempt corporation. We were put on a five-year probation period. December 31, 1999, the advance-ruling period ended, which ended our probation.

The original Constitution for the Association was written in June 1997 by a committee with Ronald Franklin as chairperson, Joyce Cunningham, Callie Boone Vassar and others as members. Callie Boone, and Joyce Cunningham made corrections to the Constitution. Joyce Cunningham said that we could not change the character of the Constitution if we wanted to remain tax-exempt. Therefore, certain changes had to be made. Ronald Franklin suggested that we give scholarship aid to the students with the money that was to go to the Navasota Day Care. He also suggested that we amend the Constitution to add a Financial Secretary as one of the elected officials. Alvin James was elected as Financial Secretary. The giving of flowers for deceased members could no longer be a part of the Association; Dorothy Marshall Jackson made a motion that all members would pay \$12.00, per year for the flower fund with the exception of the Class of 1946, which had a flower fund. Georgia Searcy Nolan became the Chairperson of the flower fund. Each year the Association continued to give scholarships to worthy students of Navasota Senior High School. We began with one scholarship per year; we are now giving three scholarships per year, along with memorial scholarships donated by family members of deceased members. The Association was increasing in membership as well as family and friends attending the mass reunion. Additional funds were brought into the scholarship fund with the sale of T-shirts, raffle tickets, bake sales, and trips to the Casino.

New officers were elected in June 1998, for 1999: President — Mildred Taylor Edwards: First Vice President-- Lorealia Mason Blanton: Second Vice President — Arthur Arrington: Secretary — Arnedra Marshall Wells: Treasurer — Dorothy Marshall Jackson: Chaplain — Burnis L. Hall.

Under the leadership of President Mildred Edwards, many committees were developed, and others continued. Currently the following committees are active: Awards Committee; Banquet Committee; Bid Committee; Program Committee; Family and Friends Committee; Souvenir Book Committee; Ways and Means Committee; Membership Committee; and Scholarship Committee.

On August 14, 2000, we received our tax-exempt status from the United States Treasury Department and were granted a 501 (c)(3) by the Internal Revenue Service. As expenses increased for the Mass Reunion, it was necessary to raise the cost of membership to \$50.00, and life membership to \$500.00 in the year 2000. To further keep the Carver Spirit alive, the Souvenir Book Committee proposed the publication of a Carver Cookbook. The book was published and sold in 2001. We sold 567 copies, which provided a substantial donation to the scholarship fund.

In November 2001, the Constitution was amended again, with James Rivers, Chairperson, Georgia James, Charlye Reese, Betty Gill, Frances Prater, and Mattye Anderson as committee members. The Constitution now allows for officers to be elected for more than two terms, the official name of the Association is now Navasota George Washington Carver High School Alumni Association, herein referred to as The Association. Budget and membership have continued to grow to meet our scholarship goals. Since 2001, we have been able to give three \$3,000.00 scholarships and three \$1,000.00 scholarships, as well as scholarship aid to existing students. Callie Boone Day was elected President of the Association in June 2011. So many of the alumni volunteer their time to keep this Association going in Carver's name, we encourage each of you to become a working part of this Association. We need your help and your ideas. In order to build our scholarship fund, we solicit items for our Friday Night Silent Auction; we encourage class donations, memorial scholarship donations, and special scholarship donations, as well as ads in our souvenir book, Casino trips, bake sales, and T-shirt sales.
