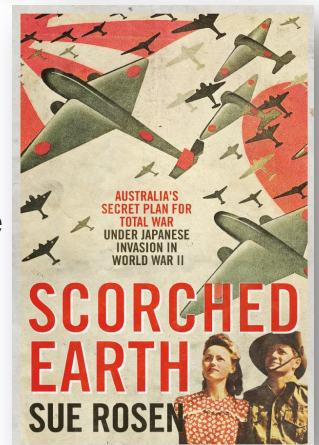
15th MAY- RAY CURRAN – DRAGON BOAT RACING
