25TH JULY- CHIEF INSPECTOR GARY RAYMOND APM, OAM (Ret'd.)

Chief Inspector Gary Raymond APM was a member of the NSW Police for 33 years. Prior to his retirement in Dec 05, Gary was performing duty at the Blacktown Police Station as a Duty Officer specialising in Emergency and Crime Scene Management. As a member of the Police Rescue Squad, Gary performed over 1,500 rescues including 1,000 motor vehicle collision rescues, 200 cliff rescues, and 200 suicide negotiations at heights such as cliffs, buildings, bridges, roofs and towers. He also performed industrial and domestic rescues. He conducted searches both on land, air and sea whilst working as crew on the police helicopter.

as Australia's Eastern War?
