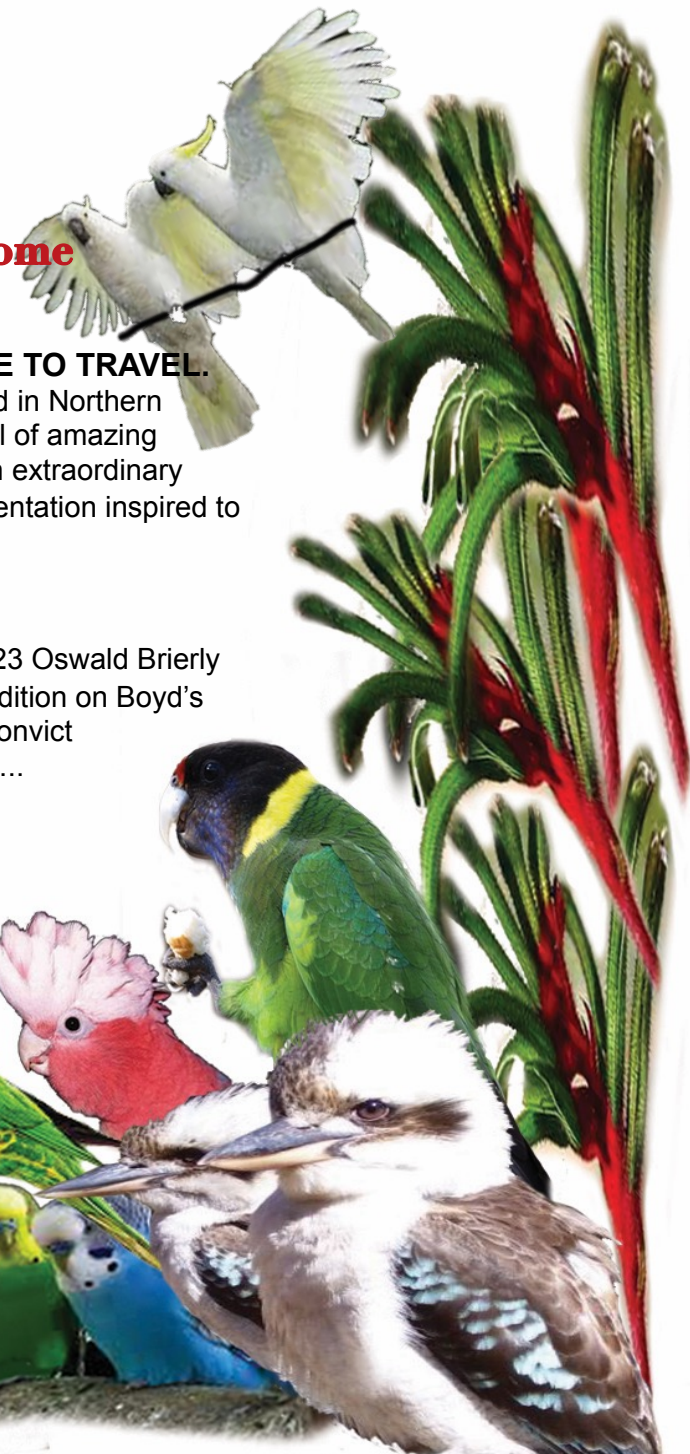

26th FEBRUARY - PHILLIP WARD - FIELD OF MARS - WILDLIFE AND HISTORY

NSW Office of the Environment and Heritage. The Field of Mars Reserve is of heritage significance for its historic, aesthetic, social and research significance as a reserve for the purposes of the preservation of native flora and fauna. The reserve is of historical significance as a remnant of one of six "commons" gazetted in 1804, resumed as Crown Land in 1874, and a remnant of 85 acres proclaimed for public recreation in 1887.

12TH MARCH - LYN LANGTRY – CHELTENHAM GIRLS HIGH SCHOOL

Cheltenham Girls High School was founded in 1957–1958 by Bessie Mitchell who also acted as the first Principal. Many of us have girls who attended this iconic school. Come and hear the history from Mrs Langtry who was the History teacher at Cheltenham Girls school for many years.

19TH MARCH - GRAHAM SIMMS – AMAZING BEA MILES

Beatrice Miles was an Australian eccentric and bohemian rebel.

Described as Sydney's "iconic eccentric", she was known for her contentious relationships with the city's taxi drivers and for her ability to quote any passage from Shakespeare for money. Graham Simms is a Master Story- teller and comes very highly recommended!



26TH MARCH – SYDNEY HARBOUR FEDERATION TRUST – NORTH HEAD



A remarkable setting, North Head Sanctuary is home to delicate and diverse flora and fauna complete with hanging swamps. Its wild, island-like nature has made this a place for isolation, observation and contemplation. Rich in history and a special place for the Aboriginal people, the dramatic cliffs of North Head form a memorable entry to Sydney Harbour with superb views of the harbour from the cliff tops.

2ND APRIL- DICK WHITTAKER – CRUISING ABOUT TOWN

“THE HISTORY OF THE MOTOR CAR IN SYDNEY” Dicks fascinating presentation explores the transition from horses to cars and the massive transformation it produced on Sydney’s urban landscape.
