2.	Accounts & Membership	There are 36 members, however 7 have not yet renewed their membership.

		 Seniors - £5 per month Juniors - £3 per month Visitors - £6 per adult, £4 per juniors 'Ad Hoc' club members the same as visitors AndyF suggested buying two more indoor bosses allowing one of the small bosses to be taken outside for the shorter distances. This will cost approx. £320 plus the cost of making two new stands. AlisonF has been continuing her analysis of attendance. This has been around 58% of membership (although this will be higher once those who have not renewed are taken off). Dechmont – AR & CD had a meeting with Tony re the state of the access to the field.
