We are supporting the Royal National Institute for the Blind by collecting used stamps.

By collecting your stamps you will make a difference to the lives of blind and partially sighted people across the UK by giving them access to the information, support and advice they need.

The RNIB will take used, first or second class, foreign, first day covers, presentation packs or albums. Stamps are sold by weight and they raise £20 per kilogram collected.

When you tear off the stamp please leave one centimetre of envelope around each stamp. If you can sort them into British and Overseas that would really help the RNIB. (Channel Islands and Isle of Man count as foreign.) The collection box can be found in the entrance as soon as you enter the school. You can recycle your ink cartridges and batteries here too.

Every day 250 people will begin to lose their sight and many will face a future without any help or support. By supporting RNIB you can help change this and give people with sight loss the gift of a brighter future.
