Take Stock and Take Action

At the last board meeting the board decided to form a task force to continue recent discussions about rules, regulations and compliance. The group had an initial meeting and members agree that the best way to improve compliance with our rules and regulations is to make sure that our residents are aware of what they say.

We are confident that all of us want our community to be safe, well kept and pleasant to live in and it is up to each of us to comply with established rules to ensure that is the case. Last month's Beacon article restated some of the most common rules of the community. This month we want to focus on clarifying what items the association is accountable for and which are owner responsibilities.

A full description of the association responsibilities and limitations can be found in your copy of the documents and owner responsibilities are outlined in both documents and the Rules and Regulations handbook. Below is an overview:

The Association

- Maintaining common areas
- Maintaining planting done by developer
- Grass cutting
- Trimming hedges
- Spraying for insects/bait boxes for rodents
- Spraying for weeds
- Exterior of residences: specifically painting, roofing, fence maintenance

- Roof cleaning (scheduled by association)
- Gutter cleaning (upon request)
- Driveway cleaning
- Sprinkler heads and other related irrigation issues

Residents

- Window repair or replacement
- Entry doors or Garage door repair or replacement
- Any interior leaks or damage
- Screen structures (both frames and screen)
- All trees not installed by developer (includes trimming, removal when diseased or threat to structures or adjacent properties and the removal of all debris and fallen fruit)


As I write this, I am listening to/watching Leonard Bernstein's majestic transversal of *Tristan und Isolde*, and it is disappointing to think that if we were to show this performance there is a strong possibility that less than a handful of people would come, either because they revile Wagner or they believe his music is too "difficult" or his operas too long (and of course the latter is undeniable).

Wagner was an odious man, but he was also a great artist whose contributions to opera cannot be overstated, nor can he be blamed for events that took place a half-century after his death. He may be an acquired taste but one that we believe is well worth the effort.

FAQs: Capital Contribution

Q: WHY DO WE NEED A CAPITAL CONTRIBUTION?

A. We need the extra money to maintain an aging community that needs a lot of upkeep and improvement.

Q: Why should we use a one-time capital contribution rather than raising the maintenance fees?

A. Higher maintenance fees are more likely to affect sales than a one-time contribution. Many communities in South Florida are choosing to have capital contributions to keep their maintenance at a lower rate.

Q: What other ways can the community raise money for improvement projects?

A. We can raise maintenance fees or levy assessments. (Assessments are one-time fees; maintenance fees are annual costs.)

Q: WHAT IMPACT DOES THE CAPITAL CONTRIBUTION HAVE ON CURRENT UNIT OWNERS?

A. This capital contribution is paid once at closing by the purchaser. People who inherit properties or acquire them through transfers from a related party are exempt from the capital contribution requirement.

Q: Who can I ask for more information?

 Speak to any member of the current board of directors for further details.

Q: How do we submit our ballot?

A. Please bring or mail it to the office (2801 Rainberry Circle) at your earliest convenience. It must be received by January 4, 2019.

Meet Your Neighbor—Barbara Braverman

We have in our midst an artist, a painter of brilliant pictures. Quiet and petite, charming and soft-spoken, her paintings demonstrate an independent spirit that reflect her originality and love of color.

Barbara is a native of Chicago, and growing up, art and dancing were her main interests. She studied Art in college and took many art and painting classes at Bradley University in Peoria, Illinois before becoming an art teacher in a public school. When she married her husband, Billy, she continued teaching and painting while he was in law school. Once she became a mother, she took time off from teaching, and stayed home for eight years to raise her son and daughter. Then, instead of returning to teaching or painting, she decided to start her own cosmetics business.

1982 Barbara opened Colorisma Cosmetics on a "wing and a prayer". At first, she had doubts about its potential for success, but she said that she was not a quitter. For twentyeight years she ran her business out of a beauty salon in the suburbs of Chicago. She ordered formulations of foundations, blush, lipsticks and jars and bottles from manufacturers, private-labeling and selling them under her own brand, Colorisma. Barbara loved helping her customers to select the correct makeup to enhance their own natural beauty. It was especially rewarding when she saw the happiness in her customers' eyes after they saw themselves, made up, revealed in the mirror. They would walk out of her shop "transformed," and word of mouth from happy clients became Barbara's best form of advertising. She also grew a big bridal makeup business in which she would beautify the bride, mother-of-the-bride, and sometimes, the whole bridal party within a few hours! She loved the excitement of wedding day business juggling the emotions of the bride and her family, while enhancing everyone's confidence for such joyous occasions.

Barbara found her entrepreneurial career rewarding on many levels: empowering women, having the freedom to make her own schedule, and create her own personal financial



four years ago. Her children had moved away, one to California and the other to New York. Billy was still working in Chicago as an attorney. That's when Barbara returned to her passion for art and began painting

When I met Barbara and saw her paintings, I was literally blown away by their striking appearance. In her portraits, the skin tones were luminous. The eyes were expressive. The lips were about to smile. As for the hair, I felt I could run my fingers through the subject's locks. Her colors seemed to carry and reflect light. Many of her paintings were four or five feet tall but didn't seem too tall for their subjects - standing figures. Although the figures were modern, something about them reminded me of medieval paintings that I had seen in museums. Barbara also animals and scenes from nature and some fanciful products from her imagination. I did a double take in front of a marvelous painting of a seated cat with a tail of peacock feathers! When she paints she said she finds peace and joy.

When Billy retired from his law career, they decided to move from Chicago to a warmer climate. She and Billy chose Delray because of its charm and culture and closeness to Boca where their daughter and her family live. At home in Chicago, Barbara painted at her dining room table. Nowadays, she shares a studio in their home with Billy's grand piano. In the evenings, while Billy plays success. She retired from Colorisma piano, Barbara can paint to her heart's

content and doesn't have to clear off the table when she's done. They moved to Rainberry Bay last year and love it here. Barbara paints, of course, and plays canasta, is a member of the book club and dances with the Nia exercise class. Billy enjoys playing classical music and playing bridge and golf and taking advanced classes to improve his bridge skills.

Shortly after they moved to Delray, they went to an art fair downtown on Atlantic Avenue. Billy suggested that Barbara might like to begin showing her paintings. He was right to suggest this. Not only does she have talent, Barbara brings with it her personal vision and depth of maturity. Folks, we are on the ground floor of a professional career that is going to take off! 





- All plantings installed by resident, both current and previous. (includes removal of dead plants, preventing over-grown plants, weeding that extends beyond contracted landscaping spray services, cracked or raised edging, etc)
- All plantings along fences both inside and out.
- Keeping proper distance of plantings from fences and structures
- Keeping plantings from obscuring mailboxes and posts
- Any modifications to the exterior of the residence or landscaping requires approval by the ACB
- Any modifications to the exterior, such as drilling holes in the stucco, attaching something to the structure that causes damage, installing TV dish, solar panels to the roof becomes the responsibility of the owner for repair, leaks, etc.

How You Can Help

The task force is asking residents to take a close look at their property for two very important reasons:

- To identify items that should be referred to the association for repair. Things such as broken sprinkler heads, cracks in stucco, clogged gutters, rotted, or damaged mailbox posts, mailboxes, dead or unsightly developer installed hedges or plantings. These items should all have work orders generated.
- 2) To identify work that needs to be done by each resident such as: removing resident-installed dead plants, trimming over-grown plants, removing rubber edging that is sticking up or cracked, making sure that fences and mailbox posts and are free of vines or plants that damage or prevent access to them.



Update on Hurricane Michael on October 14, 2018:

Travis Air Force Base in Fairfield, CA, is sending two U.S. Air Force Cargo planes to a Florida Air Force base damaged by Hurricane Michael. <u>Tyndall Air Force Base</u> in Panama City suffered "widespread catastrophic damage" and will require "extensive cleanup and repairs", said base leaders. Col. Brian Laidlaw told the 3,600 airmen stationed at the base just east of Panama City that he won't ask them or their families to return until their safety is guaranteed. The base was evacuated in advance of the Category 4 storm that struck the Gulf Coast on October 10 afternoon with 155 mph winds and a strong storm surge. President and Mrs. Trump visited on October 15. Seventeen reported deaths so far.

INTELLIGENT SKINCARE FOR A LIFETIME

Reduce, Repurpose

Bits and Pieces ...

- Eyeglass & sunglass cleaner: fill a spray bottle with 3 parts rubbing alcohol to 1 part water. Spritz on lenses and rub with a soft cloth.
- ♦ Hair dye irritation: If you "do it yourself" mix two packets of Sweet "n Low into the dye and apply as usual. The sweetener contains cream of tartar and acids that neutralize chemicals in the dye.
- ♦ Cold sore? Apply a paste made from equal parts non-gel ♦ toothpaste and salt to help dry the wound.
- ♦ Easy way to clean your oven: rub half a lemon on the bottom. ♦ Pre-heat the oven to 250 degrees and put a mediumsize, oven-safe, glass mixing bowl filled with water and four more lemon halves on the top rack and close the door. After

an hour, turn off the oven, open \$\display\$ the door and allow it to cool. Use a damp microfiber cloth to wipe down the door and \$\display\$ insides. Any stubborn spots need a gentle rub with a wet scouring pumice.

Uses for Hydrogen Peroxide:

- ♦ Add 2 to 4 Tbs. to the dish ♦ washer's rinse compartment and run as usual. Peroxide breaks down water deposits so glasses sparkle
- Soak your feet for 30 minutes in a basin of 2 cups of water and 2 cups of Peroxide to soft and provide a cooling sensation.
- Spilled wine? Blot the stain and pour ½ cup peroxide and a squirt of dish soap into a spray bottle and spritz on the stain. Blot with clean sponge or cloth and repeat as needed. (Spot test first, please.)

Stained nails from a dark nail polish? Soak your fingertips for 3 minutes in a bowl of peroxide. Keep those fresh cut flowers alive and thriving by adding 1 tsp. of peroxide to every quart of lukewarm water in the vase. The peroxide kills the bacteria in the water.

If you're like me you like to use a reusable water bottle but every now and then it needs to be sanitized. Fill the bottle with

1 part peroxide and 2 parts water. Let it sit for a few hours, rinse with warm water and let it air-dry. That should kill any bacteria in glass, plastic, or stainless-steel bottles.
