

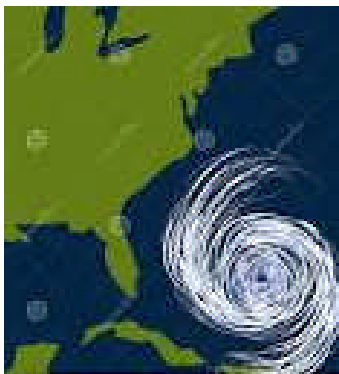

By the time you are reading this, Hurricane Season is officially over. While it's a great reason to celebrate, we still see the signs of Irma's visit all around us. But it could have been much worse. If we learned anything from this experience, it's that advance planning is absolutely necessary.

PLEASE DON'T WAIT until next hurricane season to develop your own emergency plan. Review how your planning served you this year. Decide ahead of time if and when you would evacuate and have your "grab and go" bag ready.

THINK about how you did or would manage without electricity. Know if you cannot be alone before, during or after a hurricane. The Hurricane Preparedness Committee, CERT, The Board of Directors and First Service each do their part to prepare the community and work towards our mutual recovery. But ultimately, each resident is responsible for their own safety and well-being.

THINGS TO DO NOW: Because power loss is not limited to hurricanes, make sure that you have a flashlight with fresh batteries handy to limit risk of injury if you are suddenly in the dark.

Review your important documents and make copies to keep in a zip lock bag, scan and email to yourself, or mail hard copies to a family member. Stock up on supplies and non-perishables. Service your shutters and know how to close them, or who will close them.

The New Rules and Regulations are available in the Maintenance Office for you to pick up.

The Beacon will include some of the items as a reminder to residents of what is included in them.

SAFETY & SECURITY

SECURITY / SAFETY monitors issues such as traffic safety, issues of entry to the community, neighborhood lighting and other topics that affect the general safety and welfare of Rainberry Bay Residents.

1. Visitor Call-Ins

- Visitor Call-In Notification is the responsibility of the unit owner or tenant.
- All known visitors, deliveries and service people must be called into the guardhouse (561-276-8188) before arrival.
- All visitors must show a valid driver's license.
- Unexpected visitors will be refused entry unless the security guard communicates with Resident for entry permission.
- All visitors and contractors are required to obtain a daily pass and the pass is to be clearly displayed on the vehicle dashboard at all times.

2. Residents' Entry

- All Residents' vehicles must have a Rainberry Bay vehicle barcode sticker permanently displayed on the driver's side rear window.
- The barcode is obtainable at the Management Office upon presentation of the vehicle registration and a valid driver's license.
- If a Resident is using a temporary vehicle, obtaining a color-coded, monthly pass from the Management Office will allow him/her to enter through the Resident gate by showing the pass to the guard on duty.

3. Guest Passes and Permanent Lists

- Guest Passes are color coded, good for 30-days each month and are obtainable at the Management Office.
- They must be displayed on the dashboard or rear view mirror.
- Used by family or visiting guests only on extended stays.
- Used for guests on the Residents' permanent list of five (5) qualified visitors.
- The permanent guest list should be updated by Residents every January.
- Guest Passes and Permanent Lists must not be used to gain entry for:

- Health aides, household help, gardeners or other contractors.
- Entry is through the Guest Gate and requires the display of a valid driver's license.

4. Commercial Vehicles

- All commercial vehicles belonging to private contractors, cleaning services, landscapers, etc., allowed on the site should have identification.
- When a commercial vehicle arrives without identification, the driver will be informed of the rule and allowed to enter the first time.
- Should the vehicle come a second time without proper identification, the vehicle will be turned away.
- Guest Passes are color coded, good for 30-days each month and are obtainable at the Management Office.
- They must be prominently displayed on the vehicle
- No commercial vehicles are allowed to use the Davis Road entrance.

5. Davis Road Entry Guest Passes/Permanent Lists

- Entry through the Davis Road gate will be by Residents' barcode.
- No commercial vehicles are allowed to use the Davis Road entrance.
- Telephone access is available for guests of Riviera Drive Residents ONLY.
- Any Riviera Drive Resident who allows vendors, including health care personnel, cleaning services, or commercial companies into the Davis Road gate, will have their name removed from the Davis Road gate phone system for one year.
- If the rule violation is repeated after reinstatement, their name will be removed permanently.

From The Manager's Office

November traditionally sees two major changes in Southern Florida and Rainberry Bay.

As this edition of the Beacon is distributed, we are holding our breath for the next two weeks or so, as the end of Hurricane Season quickly approaches. After 12 years of being spared, we have seen more storms approach than in years past and



an unwanted visit from Irma. Although we were lucky in the end and Irma took a turn to the west and the predicted direct hit was not felt, there were days without power, fuel shortages were experienced for the first time in many years and as is common in a hurricane, beautiful mature trees were severely damaged and destroyed.

For the many who are new to Florida in the past 12 years, it was a rude awakening. Stories of no food and water, gas lines and living in the dark, humid confines of your home became reality. Most were prepared, but some just didn't think that they needed to heed the warnings of our local and state government or the Rainberry Bay Hurricane Preparedness Committee.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank my staff for preparing Rainberry Bay for the worst possible scenario and being with this community until the last possible moment before Irma hit. In preparation for the storm, staff were allowed to leave to be with their families and prepare their personal homes or evacuate if necessary on Wednesday afternoon. Instead, the entire staff worked all day Thursday and until noon on Friday, to insure that Rainberry Bay was as well prepared to weather the storm as possible. Property damage was very limited due to their efforts.

With about two weeks left before we can exhale, please be aware that we can still have a storm pop up unexpectedly and hit hard. Be vigilant until we hear that we are in the clear for this year.

The other change we experience is the return of our Seasonal Residents. Although we are delighted to welcome old friends back to Rainberry Bay, we need to focus on the increased traffic in our streets and be conscious of the increased amount of residents walking in our streets. Please slow down. Come to a full stop at our STOP signs and slow down at the cross walks. Check twice or three times

before proceeding through any intersection and most importantly, when leaving the community, allow a second or two delay before proceeding onto Lake Ida Road. Too many vehicles are known to run that light and there have been multiple accidents.

We are about to return to "season" which offers many diverse community activities and social gatherings. Rainberry Bay comes to life when we have our full complement in residence and we welcome all back to southern Florida.

May this Thanksgiving find all of you in good health and surrounded by loved ones.

Greetings Neighbors Sales/Rental Committee

This is a must read for all Landlords regarding their tenants. This Committee has been tasked to make all landlords, past and present, aware of what is necessary to rent or continue to rent your home or villa.

You **must** apply for a Landlord permit from the city of Delray Beach. At the current time, the permit fee is \$75.00 and they are valid for 1 year.

Permits are valid from November 1 of current year through October 31 of following year. For more information go to:

or call 561-243-7203 ext. 7002.

Should a landlord not comply with getting a permit, 3 things will happen. 1. Their tenant will not be approved and should their tenants move in without approval. 2. A code officer will be sent out to the property to verify the situation and the landlord will be subject to a hefty fine. 3. They also will not receive a bar code sticker for entry.

Since the height of the season is starting, now is the time to get the permit. All renters and occupants must fill out an application for approval. There is a \$75.00 per person fee for a background check. Your renters need to submit various forms of ID. In addition, paperwork on all pets must meet the Rainberry requirements, maximum of 2 with weight allowance.

The Management office will have the necessary forms that can be electronically sent or physically picked up.

We are aware that there are many long-term renters that have gotten by with just a handshake lease. We love all the renters that have been coming back for years but now we are being asked to make this official. Plus, remember leases are only valid for 1 year at a time as are the Landlord permits and we are only doing background checks every 3 years.

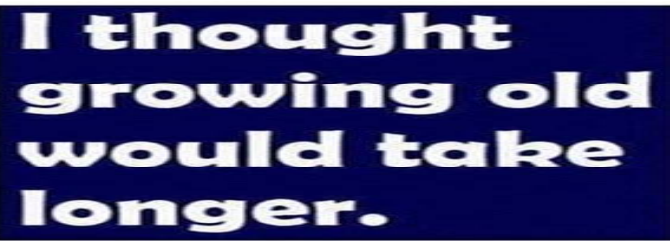

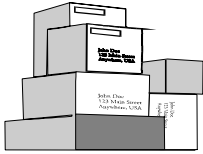

Among the merchandise that we will be offering for sale will be art treasures, pictures, dishes, household articles, decorative towels and much more.

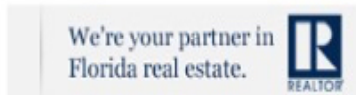

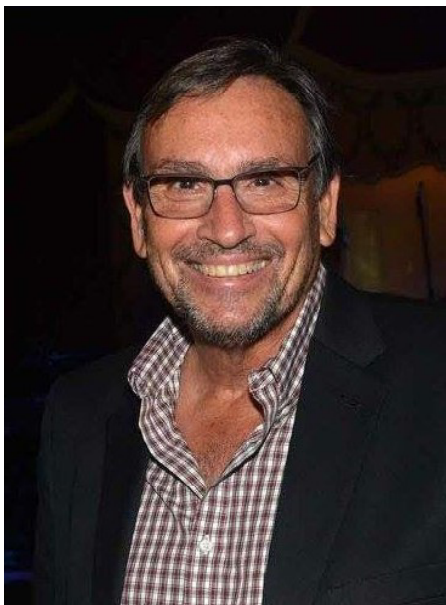

Repurpose and Reuse...

Rubbing Alcohol has many unexpected uses! (Part 2)

- Ice pack - Mix 1 part rubbing alcohol with 3 parts water in a plastic zipper bag. The rubbing alcohol prevents the bag from freezing solid.
- Odor removal - Applying rubbing alcohol to your hands after chopping onions or garlic will remove the odor just like a sanitizer.
- Soothe body aches - Rubbing alcohol brings blood flow to the skin's surface. It instantly cools and relaxes muscles.
- Itch Relief - Dabbing a little rubbing alcohol onto an itchy bug bite will dry out the area, relieving itchiness.
- Nail fungus - Soaking your hands or feet in a tub filled with water and rubbing alcohol can help get rid of bacterial growth under nails. Do this daily until fungus vanishes.
- Hand Sanitizer - mix together 3 parts rubbing alcohol and 1 part aloe vera gel.
- Air freshener - to make your own custom air freshener, mix 1 cup rubbing alcohol with 10-15 drops of an essential oil of your choice.
- Removing stickers - Remove sticky residue left behind from price tags, band aids and stickers. Soak the area for a few minutes, and wipe clean.
- Gardener's friend - rubbing alcohol can be used to clean

garden tools that have been used to remove dead, diseased and rotting plants. First clean off the tools with soap and water and then let soak in rubbing alcohol for about a minute. Wipe the tools with a clean rag that has also been soaked in rubbing alcohol.

- Disinfecting eyeglasses - Use rubbing alcohol to disinfect and clean your glasses. Eyes are very sensitive and can easily catch an infection from dirty glasses.
