FAQs: Miscellaneous

everything in Rainberry Bay, is this true?

A: The HOA is not responsible for everything. For example: we do not fix or replace gutters, put up or take down shutters, nor fix or replace extended roofs. Rainberry Bay is not responsible for caring for fruit trees (coconuts are the exception, trimmed twice a year). Fruit trees should never be planted, but if they are on your property they belong to you and are your responsibility. If you or the previous owner planted a garden, that too belongs to you. The landscapers do not maintain them.

If you want to verify who cares for any particular item, call a board member - Homes or Villas, whichever is applicable - to get the details.

Q: My realtor told me the HOA cares for Q: Is it true I am allowed to put solar panels on my home/villa?

A: Both the Homes and Villas boards have guidelines for solar panels. Please check with the appropriate board to find out which rules apply.

Q: I notice we received coupons recently. Will we still receive the quarterly letters?

A: No, these take the place of the quarterly letters. If your payment is not received by the 30th of the month it is due, you will receive a letter advising you what is owed, including the late fee. If you misplace your coupon booklet, the office will provide a paper statement for you to use. Remember, the office will stop taking payments on the 20th of the month the maintenance is due. Your payment must be mailed or paid online after the 20th.

Q: What happens if someone moves in who is younger than 55 or has small children (under 18)?

A: Rainberry Bay is a 55+ community. As such, there needs to be one person 55 or older permanently in residence. No resident may be under 18 years old. Rainberry Bay will take steps to remove any underage occupants if there is no permanent occupant over 55 or if anyone who lives here is under 18.

She has already become involved in learning bridge and canasta and is interested in joining the Monday painting class and maybe we'll see her at the weekly tennis clinics. Susan also attends our current events meetings Thursday on mornings, CERT meetings at the firehouse and she is a member of the Block Captains committee who will be welcoming new residents. Grab her quickly before she runs out of time to volunteer any further. As a new retiree, Susan is joyful about the variety of tempting activities and is eager to engage in new pursuits. But beware of her zest for life when she intentionally takes the opposite stance in a discussion just for fun to keep it lively!

As the oldest of four children, Susan's parents prepared her to take on future leadership positions. They encouraged her to believe in herself, that she could do anything she set her mind to within reason. She was especially proud that her ability was recognized in a university environment where men were usually chosen for high level positions. She loves to travel, eat new foods and meet new people. She cherishes her friendships with people she knows from as far back as her school days in Long Island.

Susan retired from a career as Director of Administration and Finance at different universities beginning with Yale University Medical School, Department of Psychiatry. At the same time she attended the Barney School, University of Hartford, part-time where she attained an MBA degree. She enjoyed living near Yale's University Theater in New Haven. When her



mother in Long Island would tell Susan about a new play on Broadway, Susan would say, *"I already saw it!"* because Broadway shows often used New Haven for their tryouts.

As the treasurer for this project, Susan arranged for the lease of a house and property. She contracted with interior designers who would decorate different rooms with free-standing or built-in furniture, lighting, decorative accessories and kitchen and bath equipment and floor tiles or carpets. etc. Each interior designer had to compete to decorate a specific room in the house. If you've never been to a showcase house, it's worth the experience and the entry fee is a charitable contribution. Susan kept track of the money coming in and going out. In addition to this event,

along with another committee, the Junior League would award money to such community organizations as preschools, food kitchens or libraries. Susan sought out the Junior League in every city where she lived.

For fun, Susan tried many different sports and activities. She sang in high school and college and with holiday choruses. She sings in the shower and in her car. Maybe Susan would like to join our Theater Arts Group. She learned to fence, had a weekly radio talk show interviewing people and best of all, she loved sculling. Sculling is rowing a long skinny boat in unison with others on a river. She joined a class on how to scull at a junior college in Philadelphia. The class took place at 6 a.m. twice a week. Some sculls seated one, others held two or more rowers in single file. When she would arrive at the dock, she had to remove her shoes and sit down in the boat that had built-in shoes to put her feet in. Susan said, "When rowing you had to synchronize your movements with the person in front of you." When the scull was properly synchronized the boat moved gracefully and swiftly through the water.

She chose Delray Beach as her new home because of the variety of social activities and the beach. She also has a friend who lives nearby who encouraged her to look at Rainberry Bay. Susan was impressed with the different styles of houses and landscaping and because she thought it was beautiful. She loves warm weather, but always visits her mother and sisters and brother and their families in Long Island for holidays despite the northern temperatures.

The 18th Century Club?

Not yet. And maybe never. But it's evident we are more comfortable with the culture of the 18th and 19th centuries than that of the 20th or 21st, at least to anyone who's attended any of the Rainberry Bay Classic Opera/Ballet movies. And maybe that's why you haven't.

In any event, if Rainberry has a club that looks ahead, why not one that looks back? It's worth thinking about, no? We're not saying we need to buy wigs and affect English accents, but what's wrong with a little touch of Verdi in the afternoon? *"And so ends our catechism."*

For our January schedule, we go all the way back to the early 17th Century (1607 to be precise), when Claudio Monteverdi's *L'Orfeo* was first performed at the annual Carnival in Mantua. Monteverdi's setting of the Greek myth of Orpheus is the oldest regularly performed opera. Attempting to recreate the music of classical Greece, *L'Orfeo* bridges 16th century choral polyphony and the "modern" style that featured solo vocal music. Come see and hear how opera began.

The other January performance *–I Am a Dancer–* is a documentary about Rudolph Nureyev, one of the 20th Century's greatest male dancers. It features excerpts from several classical ballets as well as Glenn Tetley's modern (and astonishing) *Field Figures*. As one reviewer noted, it is "an extraordinary document for anyone who appreciates Nureyev in his prime and an era of great dancing that is lost forever."

OPERATION PILL DROP.

In 2002 the Solid Waste Authority (SWA) & the Palm Beach County Sheriff's Office ("PBSO") partnered to provide locations for the proper disposal of unwanted pills & lotions to keep medications away from children, out of the water supply and the hands of dumpster divers with nefarious purposes and to protect solid waste workers from injuries. Medications should not be flushed or put in the garbage or recycle bins.

Reduce, Repurpose

You may or may not have denture tablets on hand but they're pretty inexpensive to buy, especially if you can snag them at your local dollar store! They can clean a multitude of items:

STAINED FOOD CONTAINERS: Plastic food container stained since you stored spaghetti in it that one time? Fill the container with warm water and add 1-2 denture cleaning tablets. After an hour wash the container with soapy water.

Yellowed Fingernails: Are your fingernails stained or discolored? To restore them put one cup of warm water in a bowl and drop in a denture tablet. Soak for 5 minutes, then wash your hands. Repeat daily until the discoloration is gone. NARROW VASES & BOTTLES: Denture

tablets are great for cleaning out containers with narrow openings. Just fill the vase or bottle with warm



water and add 1-2 denture tablets, depending on the size of the item. Wait an hour or two then rinse well. Enamel Cookware or Baked on denture tablets. Put the bag over messes: Can't remove the food the residue or stains? Fill the pot or pan with warm water and add 1-2 denture tablets. When the fizzing stops, wash the pot or pan in warm the bag and scrub the shower head soapy water. For baked on messes with sponge or brush to scrub away fill the dish with warm water and the loosened gunk, and it should be add one denture tablet. Let the dish soak for an hour, then wash normally. Use a scrub brush or the scrubby side of a sponge to power through the loosened mess.

Mugs With Coffee Or Tea Stains: Fill a stained mug with warm water and add one denture tablet. Wait until the fizzing stops, then wash the mug with soapy water. This also works on kettles, carafes, and thermoses too!

Shower Heads: If your shower head isn't flowing as well as it used to put a few cups of warm water into a plastic ziplock bag and add 1-2 shower until head its submerged, then use a rubber band to tie the bag in place. Let it soak for a couple of hours, remove good as new!

Toilet Bowls: Drop 2-3 denture tablets in your toilet bowl and let them sit for at least 30 minutes. Then brush and flush for a clean toilet!
