① The Advent wreath contains a number of symbols. The evergreen wreath symbolizes eternal life in Christ. The candles are symbolic of Jesus Christ, the Light of the World. The act of lighting more candles each week anticipates the imminent coming of Christ. The **Prophecy Candle** announces a period of waiting for our Lord. The **Bethlehem Candle** symbolizes preparing to receive the Christ Child. The **Shepherds' Candle** symbolizes sharing of the news of Christ's birth. The **Angels' Candle** symbolizes Christ's final coming on Judgment Day when He will appear in glory with all His angels. The **Christ Candle** is lighted on Christmas Eve. This central candle signifies that the Light of the World, Jesus, has come.

AS WE GATHER: King David is the best known of all of Israel's kings. Under David's reign, the kingdom grew and flourished. Even generations later would look back and view the days of King David as the "Golden Age" of Israel. In today's Old Testament Reading, a promise is made to David: "And your house and your kingdom shall be made sure forever before Me. Your throne shall be established forever" (2 Samuel 7:16). But in this greater kingdom, this eternal kingdom, it's not King David who will reign on the everlasting throne—it's King Jesus. Jesus, the descendant of David, is greater than David and will have a never-ending reign. It's the coming of this King of kings that we prepare to celebrate.

AS WE COME INTO THE SANCTUARY - let us be sensitive to the needs of those who use the quiet and reverence of the Prelude as a time to prepare their hearts and minds for the Divine Service. ALSO: Out of respect for God's House and courtesy for other worshippers, please turn off all cell phones. Please also encourage one another to show respect to <u>God</u>, <u>His Word</u>, <u>our fellow-worshipers</u>, and <u>our Pastor</u> by limiting movement during Scripture Readings, Sermon & prayers. THE CHANCEL FLOWERS this Sunday are given to the Glory of God by George and Betty Nelson in celebration of their son Eddie and granddaughter Danielle's birthdays!

IN TODAY'S SUNDAY SCHOOL LESSON the children learned that as Jesus came to the Ethiopian (Acts 8:26–40). He comes to us in our weakness, for we cannot by our own reason or strength come to Him. In your family faith talks, discuss how the Holy Spirit calls, gathers, enlightens, and sanctifies us, keeping us with Jesus Christ in the one true faith.

<u>SUNDAY MORNING ADULT BIBLE</u>: "Leviticus: Life in the Blood" -- Holiness. What is it? Leviticus shows how God goes to great lengths not only in defining true holiness, but also in sharing His holiness with his redeemed and ransomed people.


