



PROPERTY COMMITTEE REPORT AND APPEAL

The main roll of the property committee is to maintain and upgrade the fabric of the buildings and grounds owned by the church (listed below) in accordance with current legislation and under the guidance of Presbytery namely:

The Church Building –The Manse –The Church Hall – The Graveyard and Grounds and Two Retirement Houses –

We presently have ten members on the committee. It would be a fair and reasonable assessment to say that the committee and the work party do a fantastic job dealing with the maintenance tasks which they face throughout the year and I would take this opportunity to thank every member for their willingness and commitment dealing with matters arising. However, we do have limited resources.

We require to expand our man/woman power resources to meet the challenges ahead. Presently the work party deals with general repairs and maintenance work where appropriate and to save costs only use outside contractors where necessary. Presently we have a list of contractors and require to increase our options for tradesmen, general helpers etc. We are also looking for additional committee members.

Qualified electricians and qualified heating engineers are required and mandatory. All trades such as rough casters, stone masons, roofers, joiners, painters, plumbers, carpet fitters, etc. are also required from time to time.

Should you know a local contractor whom you have used in the past, were satisfied with their work, and would recommend please forward their contact details. You may already have the skills mentioned above and may be available to offer some help. It would be greatly appreciated if you could assist.
