## **President's Message for September**

We had an excellent illustration of this on a recent urban walk in the environs of the Port Whitby Marina. While we were walking there, an interesting boat docked at the marina and we were able to take pictures and talk to at least one of the crew. HMCS Oriole is the sail-training vessel of the Royal Canadian Navy, normally based in Halifax. It's a 31-metre ketch that was built in Toronto in 1921 for George Gooderham when he was Commodore of the Royal Canadian Yacht Club (and President of Gooderham and Worts).

The Royal Canadian Navy acquired the Oriole in 1943. The ship is currently on a tour of the Great Lakes with eighteen sailing trainees on board. It was completely serendipitous that it should have docked in Whitby while we were walking in the area. Only those who were out on the walk got to see it. (Although you can see some photos on pages 4 & 5.) **You shoulda been there!** 

This is an encouragement to our members to be engaged in our activities. You won't see George Aitken hit a hole in one (a very long shot I'm told) unless you're out with our golfing group. Nor can you enjoy Stella Dorsman's excellent maple baked beans if you're not part of the potluck dinner group.


