Those who have lived here for the last couple of decades know that UOIT has had an enormous impact on this community since its founding in 2003. And I firmly believe it will have an increasingly important impact in the future. We'll be learning more about the university's plans and directions from Dr. Murphy.

I trust everyone is surviving the winter chill. Spring is not that far away. Hope to see you at our February 13th meeting.


