Common One Octave Scales

for Violin

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The sheet music displays ten common one-octave scales for violin, each starting on a different note and ending on the same note an octave higher. The scales are:

- G**: Starting on G (IV), the scale goes up to G' (IV). Fingerings: 0, 1, 2, 3; 0, 1, 2, 3; 0, 1, 2, 3.

- C**: Starting on C (IV), the scale goes up to C' (IV). Fingerings: 3, 0, 1, 2; 3, 0, 1, 2; 3, 0, 1, 2.
- F**: Starting on F (III), the scale goes up to F' (IV). Fingerings: 2, 3, 0, 1; 2, 3, 0, 1; 2, 3, 0, 1; I (4), 0, 1.
- Bb**: Starting on Bb (IV), the scale goes up to Bb' (IV). Fingerings: 2, 3, 0, 1; 2, 3, 0, 1; 2, 3, 0, 1.
- Eb**: Starting on Eb (III), the scale goes up to Eb' (IV). Fingerings: 1, 2, 3, 4; 1, 2, 3, 4; 1, 2, 3, 4.
- Ab**: Starting on Ab (IV), the scale goes up to Ab' (IV). Fingerings: 1, 2, 3, 4; 1, 2, 3, 4; 1, 2, 3, 4.

Each scale is written in 4/4 time with a treble clef. Fingerings are indicated by numbers below the notes, and half-step fingerings are shown with a downward-pointing triangle symbol (▽) between notes.
