

Fire Station Visit





Over the last two academic years the school has been working hard at developing a strong partnership with Greater Manchester Fire and Rescue Service through their young person and schools outreach projects.

The team at Whitehill Fire Station have delivered a variety of activities including; CPR training, crime reduction and water safety. The school was recently invited to visit the station and have a guided tour by two firefighters.

The morning began with a session about fire safety and hoax calls. Students learnt about the dangers of making a hoax call and explored consequences both morally and legally. After a thought provoking video the firefighters then took us on a tour of the station and its appliances.

Students had the opportunity to see the real life saving equipment and practice using it. A highlight for all was using the fire hoses in the stations yard. Students explored the fire engine and asked some interesting and mature questions.
