

OREWA NORTH PRIMARY SCHOOL

Proposed Enrolment Scheme

The Orewa North Primary School Board of Trustees is in the process of implementing an enrolment scheme as directed by the Ministry of Education under Section 11H(1) of the Education Act 1989.

The purpose of an enrolment scheme, as set out in Section 11A of the Education Act 1989 is:

- (a) to avoid overcrowding, or the likelihood of overcrowding, at the school; and
- (b) to ensure that the selection of applicants for enrolment at the school is carried out in a fair and transparent manner; and
- (c) to enable the Secretary of Education to make best use of existing networks of State schools.

All students who live within the home zone shall be entitled to enrol at the school.

Orewa North School (1406) Enrolment Scheme

1 January 2018

Home Zone

All students who live within the home zone described below and shown on the attached maps shall be entitled to enrol at the school.

Starting at the Hibiscus Coast Highway that crosses Orewa River, travel north along Hibiscus Coast Highway (even addresses 214 and above, odd addresses 265 and above included, off roads included, Skyes Avenue, Waiwera Place, Waiwera Road and The Strand included) to State Highway One – Waiwera On Ramp (Northbound).

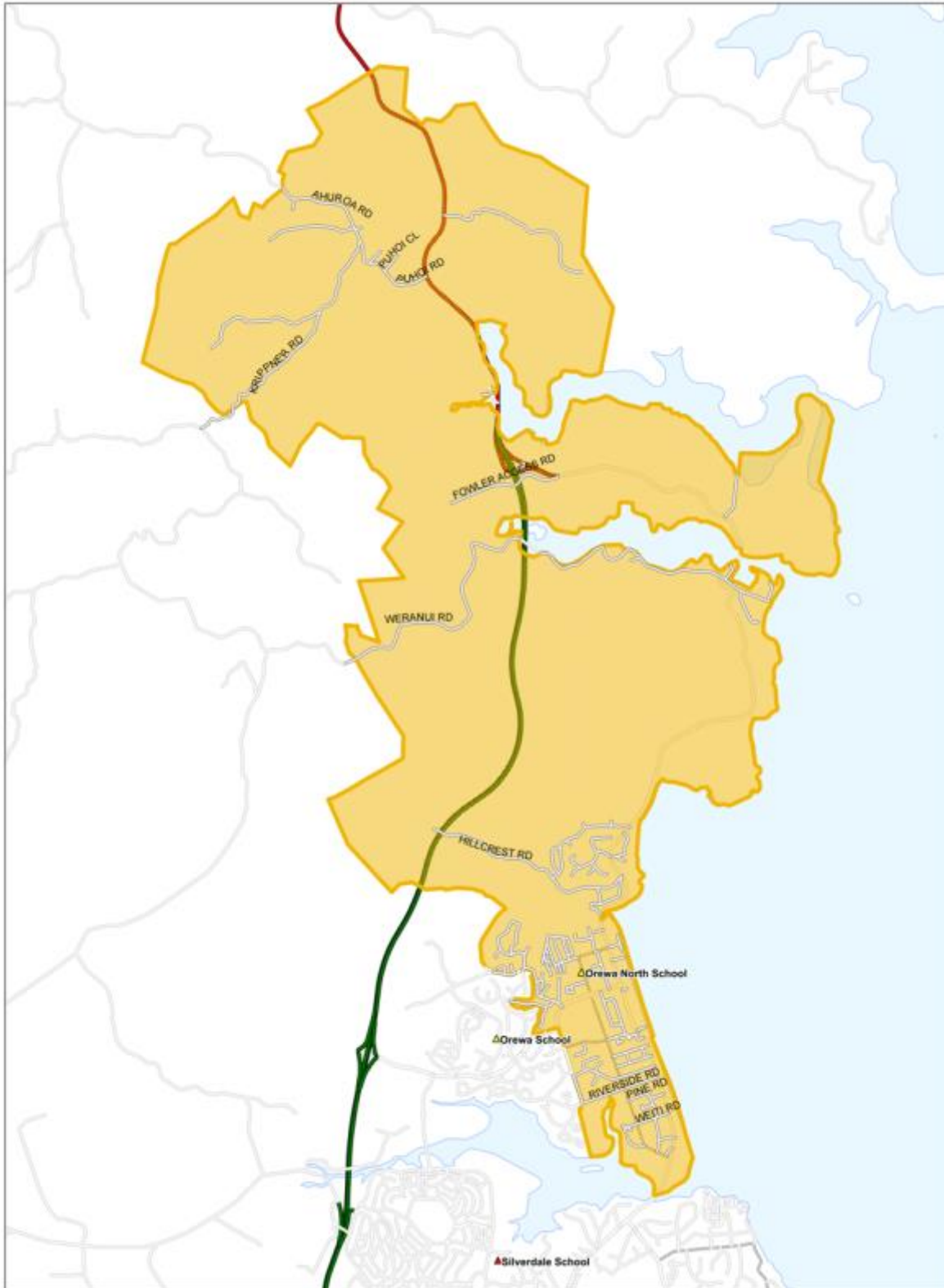
Travel North West along State High Way One and continue north onto the Northern Motorway and continue north back onto State Highway One (683 and below included, Link Road and Hungry Creek Road included). Travel south-west across country to Ahuroa Road (85 and below included – Rosa Villa Lane included). Travel east along Ahuroa Road (off roads included) and continue south to Puhoi Road. Continue south along Puhoi Road and travel south west along Krippner Road (180 and below included and Fiddlers Hill Road). Travel south east across country to Fowler Access Road (included). From Fowler Access Road, travel south across to Weranui Rd (536 and below included).

Travel south across country to Hillcrest Road (157 and below included) and then south across country to West Hoe Road (Sunnyheights Road and Kakariki Views excluded, odd addresses 161 and below included, even addresses 116 and below included). Continue south along West Hoe Road (19-27 and 30 Ambassador Glade and Carlton Way included) to Hatton Road. Continue south along Hatton Road (odd addresses only) to Riverside Road (83 and below included). Travel south along Centreway Road (odd and even addresses included, Bellbrid Place, Weiti Road, Tui Lane, Fantail Court and Edgewater Grove included) back to the starting point.

All residential addresses on included sides of boundary roads and all no exit roads off included sides of boundary roads are included in the zone unless otherwise stated.

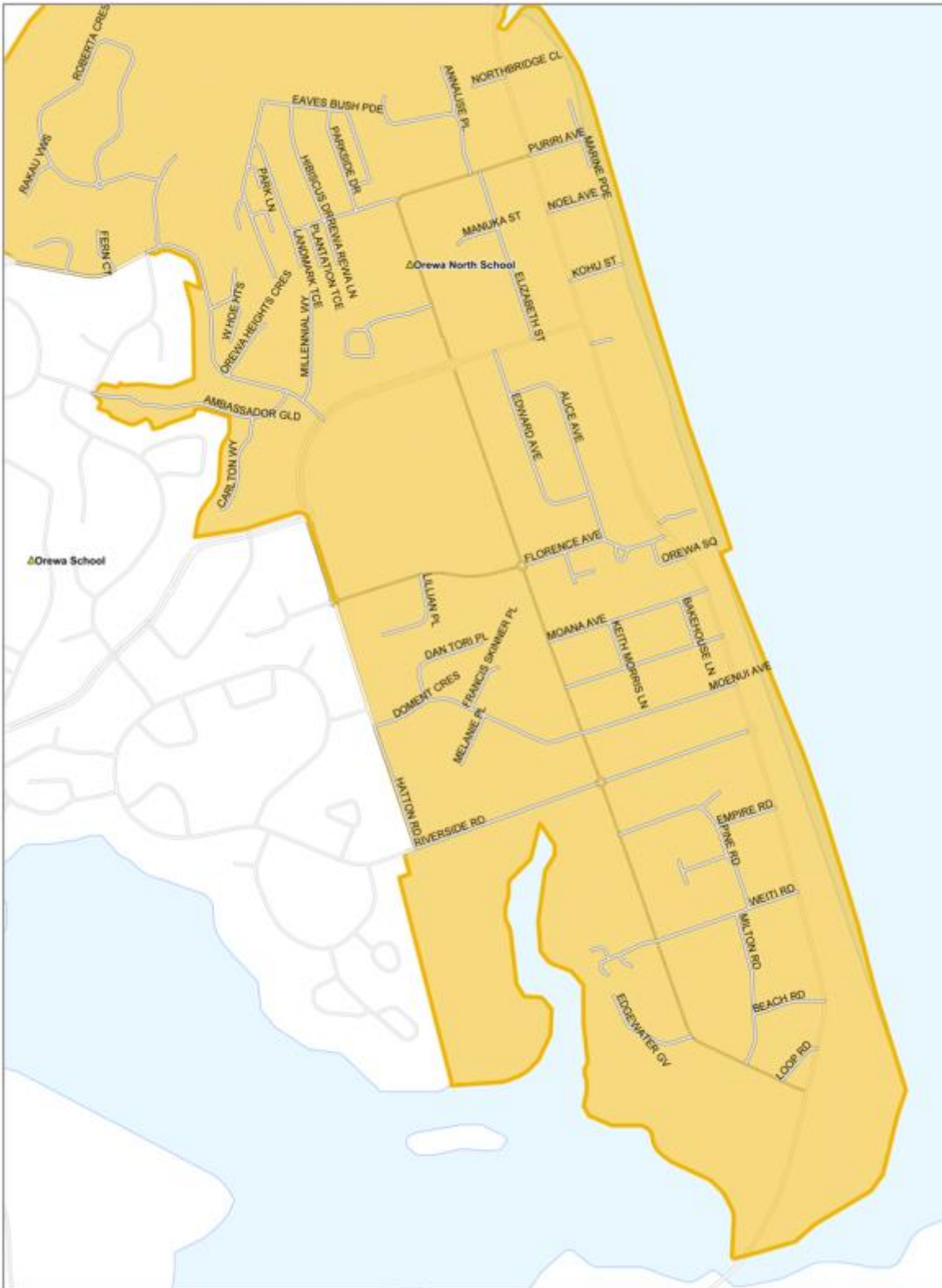
Proof of residence within the home zone will be required.

Each year, applications for enrolment in the following year from in-zone students will be sought by a date which will be published in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. This will enable the board to assess the number of places which can be made available to students who live outside the home zone.

Out of Zone Enrolments

Each year the board will determine the number of places which are likely to be available in the following year for the enrolment of students who live outside the home zone. The board will publish this information by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school. The notice will indicate how applications are to be made and will specify a date by which all applications must be received.

Applications for enrolment will be processed in the following order of priority:

<u>First Priority</u>	this priority category is not applicable at this school because the school does not run a special programme approved by the Secretary
<u>Second Priority</u>	will be given to applicants who are siblings of current students.
<u>Third Priority</u>	will be given to applicants who are siblings of former students.
<u>Fourth Priority</u>	will be given to any applicant who is a child of a former student of the school.
<u>Fifth Priority</u>	will be given to any applicant who is either a child of an employee of the board of the school or a child of a member of the board of the school.
<u>Sixth Priority</u>	will be given to all other applicants.

If there are more applicants in the second, third, fourth, fifth or sixth priority groups than there are places available, selection within the priority group will be by a ballot conducted in accordance with instructions issued by the Secretary under Section 11G(1) of the Education Act 1989. Parents will be informed of the date of any ballot by notice in a daily or community newspaper circulating in the area served by the school.

Applicants seeking second or third priority status may be required to give proof of a sibling relationship.
