Rain Policy is as follows:

Projects & Family Updates



The Schoolhouse Roof

has been leaking and the Board has worked to find the cause and have this repaired before any permanent damage occurred. A roofing specialist was hired and this project was completed this spring.

The Historic Depot on the grounds was originally built prior to the War Between the States. This building was saved by the Troutman family. It is probably the most original and well preserved NC depot of its era. The current roof needs to be replaced. It is not leaking yet but it is old and we need to be proactive and replace the roof as soon as possible. This will be a major project. More to come on this as we continue to get quotes to replace.




Looking for Volunteers.

A few years ago there were plans to have a Memorial Garden placed near the depot to honor and recognize Victor Eugene Troutman, the man most responsible for saving the depot, and Leon "Buzz" Troutman. Both men served the family in various capacities all during their lifetimes. Our local Horticultural Agent with the NC Cooperative Extension service is assisting with design of the gardens.
