DIOCESE OF SAN JOSE SAFE ENVIRONMENT

- “All personnel in every Diocesan institution or Catholic school who have regular contact with children, minors and/or vulnerable adults must comply with Safe Environment Requirements...Any persons, who are involved in **any overnight activity with a child in any Diocesan institution or program**, even if only on one occasion, shall be deemed to have ‘regular contact with children.’ (p.8)”
- **“Safe Environment Requirements:** shall mean the personal screening process established by the Diocese, acknowledgement of receipt of the Diocesan Adult Code of Conduct, and completion of the Safe Environment training program (Shield the Vulnerable, or equivalent). Safe Environment training must be renewed every three (3) years (p. 6).”
- All employees 18 years of age or older, and volunteers who work with youth are required to complete the following “safe environment” course via the Shield the Vulnerable online course (www.shieldthevulnerable.org) every three (3) years:
 - Course 706: Protect Children (San Jose – CA)
