Key facts about the WASPI campaign

- **Women** born in the 1950s are facing financial hardship in retirement because of the lack of notice of the government's changes to their State Pension Age (SPA) of up to six years.
- **Women** had as little as eighteen months' notice; some women still don't know their SPA has changed.
- 3.4 million women are affected.
- **WASPI** wants the government to make fair transitional arrangements, i.e. a bridging pension at a lower rate to cover the period between their old and new SPA. We are not asking for the SPA to be reversed.
- The **WASPI** campaign supports the equalisation of the state pension age, but does not agree with the unfair way the changes were implemented.
- **WASPI** has secured eight debates in Parliament, has an All Party Parliamentary Group which supports its aims and its members are pursuing a complaint of maladministration to the Department of Work and Pensions.
