



Health and Safety for Volunteers

- You must only do tasks that have been assigned to you.
- You must only do tasks you have been trained to do, or are familiar with.
- You must not do tasks you think are unsafe. If you feel unsafe at any time you must stop what you are doing immediately and contact Pet Guardian Network.
- You must report any hazards or risks identified to Pet Guardian Network immediately.
- We welcome any feedback on health and safety issues: speak up if you have safety concerns.
- You must not engage in any activity that puts yourself or others at risk.
- If at any time you are concerned with the behaviour of the animal (e.g. any aggression from a dog) please cease your volunteer task immediately and report this to Pet Guardian Network.
- Should you injure yourself on an assignment please seek medical treatment and contact Pet Guardian Network to advise.

What to do in an Emergency

- Should you injure yourself whilst on a volunteer assignment please seek medical treatment immediately.
- Contact Pet Guardian Network and report the incident.
- Should an animal be injured whilst on a volunteer assignment please contact the client immediately.
- If the animal needs veterinary treatment please contact the client first if they are not available please take the animal to the nearest veterinary clinic and contact Pet Guardian Network.
- In a severe emergency (life or death situation) please take the animal to the nearest veterinary clinic. Then contact the client and Pet Guardian Network.
