Australia's Premier cheese-making Facility

Australia's Legendairy™ Capital will soon also be home to Australia's premier cheese-making facility, with Fonterra Australia this week announcing its plans to rebuild and expand its Stanhope cheese plant, which as most locals would be aware was destroyed by fire last December.

The new facility will be bigger and better for Stanhope – more cheese, more jobs and the introduction of state-of-the-art processes within the factory and for managing wastewater at the farm.

Fonterra Oceania Managing Director Judith Swales says the new plant will help Fonterra to deliver on its strategy to make Australia its global hub for cheese, whey, and infant formulas, complementing its domestic retail and foodservice businesses.

"We'll produce hard cheeses including cheddar, gouda, romano and mozzarella at Stanhope, with whey from the cheese production going to our Darnum and Dennington plants, which are at the core of our growing Australian infant formula business.

"Importantly, this investment secures the long-term future of our Stanhope factory, meaning that we'll be making Australia's leading culinary cheese, Perfect Italiano, here for many years to come," said Ms Swales.

More cheese means the new plant will require significant growth of the local milk pool by 2020, and demonstrates Fonterra's commitment to supporting our local farmers and growing the dairy industry in Northern Victoria in the long term. It also means the community of Stanhope can be assured that their claim to be the Town of the Tastiest Cheese remains intact.

Planning for the new plant is still underway, however construction will commence in 2016, and is expected to be completed in 2017. For more information on the project please contact the Site Manager, Jason Wright on: 5852 0700.

**Monash University—
Student Vacation Program**

Fonterra has engaged 3 university students to work on a summer vacation arts project at the Stanhope factory.

**The project will be titled:
Using story-telling and creativity to strengthen a community brand**

PROJECT DESCRIPTION:

The students will work with stakeholders from the community of Stanhope, Fonterra and Local Government to design a creative and innovative public arts installation (mural) of significant size (approx 50m W x 8 m H) that tells the story of Fonterra's presence in the dairy industry and in particular its connection to the people of Stanhope as the 'Town of the Tastiest Cheese' and the Legendairy capital of Australia.

The project will require the student team to:

- research the history of dairying and the evolution of the town of Stanhope by accessing written literature and interviewing community members and Fonterra employees to gain an understanding of the underlying social connection and values base of both the town and factory.
- liaise with local community representatives and key stakeholders during the design project.
- identify innovative ways that an arts piece can engage with the viewer whilst still connecting to the subject site. This may include use of light, shade, multimedia, architectural materials, etc to create an effect or enhance an image by day and/or night.
- consider marketing tools that can be implemented and/or leveraged to achieve the project outcomes and create a place that people will want to come and visit.

PROJECT OUTCOMES:

- Support community capacity building by:
- creating a signature project that enhances a strong community brand for Stanhope.
 - build trust around Fonterra's vision to be the natural source of dairy nutrition.
 - support the community of Stanhope by helping to encourage more visitors to the town and stimulate the local economy and tourism.

The Annual meeting of the shed was held recently and the year's activities were reviewed. It is exactly a year since our official opening and the shedders have been very busy with varied activities. In January and February weekly pool parties were run to raise the profile of the swimming pool. Large numbers attended and Cr. Adrian Weston organised a grant for a gas BBQ for the pool.

Many social functions have been enjoyed such as a Roast night, BBQ and live music evenings, music afternoons and Friday coffee and bull ---- mornings.

Men's Health Week in June saw Beyond Blue speaker Tim Richardson speaking on hope, recovery and resilience in the face of depression and anxiety. A large crowd attended and from comments received they found the talk interesting and worthwhile. The Community Health team conduct weekly strength and balance exercises for men and these have been very warmly received. Hearing tests were conducted.

Grants have been received to purchase tools and equipment. Two co-ordinators were appointed this year to assist with the running of the shed. Des Crichton and Graham Wakefield very capably undertook the task. Garage sales have been held at the shed and a number of donated items have been turned into a profit such as the sale of fruit bins, many of which have been used for vegetable gardens.

Men from Murray Human Services in Kyabram have been regular attendees at the shed and have been of great assistance with the painting of Christmas decorations. These have been organised through the shire to decorate the town. We have large numbers of reindeer, Santa's, sleighs and Christmas trees all being decorated. The men have also assisted with dismantling timber crates and pallets. One man is very good at repairing small motors and machinery and others have been making name plates and furniture, so they have been very busy and we are glad to have them on board.

We are thankful for the generous support of Fonterra, JN & R Engineering and Unilever for their donations of timber pallets and packing. These have been used to make many projects at the shed, such as the manger scene last Christmas, sandboxes for the Kinder, possum boxes, elephant feet to raise the height of furniture, tables, Christmas decorations, a garden arch, Barbie ute, horse float and stable. Repairing items brought in has also occupied plenty of man hours and assisted clubs such as the Lions Club and the Tennis Club.

The shed is currently open Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings and is open to all district folk, so pop in sometime and see what there is, metal work, woodwork, a friendly cuppa and a chat.
