Turning waste into renewable energy and creating jobs John Bourke's "Waranga Green Energy" receives \$1 million grant.

John Bourke's "Waranga Green Energy" receives \$1 million grant. The Andrews Labor Government has confirmed the first group of successful recipients of its \$20 million

New Energy Jobs Fund grants.

While making the announcement of the grant at John Bourke's piggery last week the Minister for Energy, Environment and Climate Change Lily D'Ambrosio said, "We're proud to be supporting a bio-energy project which works to minimise emissions, maximise energy efficiency and create local jobs."

Waranga Green Energy will receive \$1 million to fund a self-sustaining mixed agriculture bio-energy project — which will construct a bio-digester that can process up to 200 tonnes per day of agricultural waste to generate renewable heat and power.

The power and heat produced will then be available to power the adjacent

piggery, as well as heat a co-located horticultural greenhouse operation with the excess CO₂ used to enhance horticultural growth.

As part of this project high quality organic fertilizer will also be produced for sale.

Located at Stanhope, the bio-energy plant has been designed to minimise greenhouse gases, maximise energy efficiency and remove waste disposal constraints which are currently preventing expansion of the piggery. The project represents a significant investment for the region, with more than 30 local jobs expected to be generated and a project value of \$31 million.

It's one of 24 grants which will be announced in the coming months, with Waranga Green Energy obtaining funding under the technology category. The fund is a key component of the \$200 million Future Industries Fund to support high growth, high value industries, such as the new energy technologies sector that are critical to securing Victoria's future.



Fonterra Update

As reported last month, Monash University student Bradley Serry is back working with Fonterra on the <u>Stanhope Arts Mural</u>. Bradley is developing the project plan that will set out the steps for completing this exciting initiative including how we secure more than 3,000 photographs that will eventually comprise the mural that will go on the outside of the new cheese plant.

Some of you may recall the concept that we shared earlier this year.



We want the mural to tell the story of Stanhope as a northern Victorian dairy town - the Legendairy capital of Australia – and represent some the things that make you proud about your town and its contribution to the dairy industry.

Bradley will be in Stanhope late November / early December to meet with local residents and take you through a proposal to get you involved with the project. For those who may want to get snapping early (given it is Spring) don't let us hold you back – just make sure your photos are a minimum of 1,000 pixels wide.

Toilet Block & Art Space Opening

At an Onsite Meeting at the Amenities Block & Art Space last month, the committee raised several issues, which were required to finalise the project.

- Men's shed to make a 'Stanhope' sign made out of horseshoes, curving along the back wall.
- A round Table and Seating to be installed in front of curved back wall (Men's shed to make).
- A long Bench Seat to go along the Length of Slated Wall outside Toilet Block (Men's shed to make).
- Lawn to be planted the front and side of site.
- Install a Native Garden & Mulch area in front of curved path.
- Blue Metal Path leading from Art Space to be redone in Concrete.
- A concrete path to be installed from Bus Stop over to main concrete path leading to Art Space.
- Planting of colourful flowers in planter pots in main street and painting of each pot.
- Reattach seating to planter pots.
- The bin from the Hall to be moved to in front of the Stanhope Café.
- **Keep** the old tables and chairs from the main street and repaint them to go over in lawn area at Toilet Block (Men's shed to do).

Due to the wet weather there has been a hold up with in installation of the new lawn and garden as well as the finishing of the footpath at the Toilet site. Hopefully it dries out enough before the 15th October so that the footpath can be finished, but it is very unlikely to get the lawn in. The new seating for the main street should be installed before Saturday 15th which will be situated in the new paved area in the laneways as well as a back slatted wall to enclose the area off.

Local government elections Campaspe Shire Council

Cr Adrian Weston – Re elected unopposed in the Waranga Ward.

Sixteen candidates are standing for the Campaspe Shire elections in the five wards.

Nominations have closed, with the three single-representation wards uncontested, being Cr Leigh Wilson (Rochester Ward), Cr Leanne Pentreath (Western Ward) and Cr Adrian Weston (Waranga Ward). There will be no voting in these three wards.

The remaining two wards have a number of candidates for the three positions. The Echuca Ward has eight candidates in ballot order, Paul Jarman, Thomas Weyrich, Annie Vickers, Kristen Munro, Eric Grumont, Peter Williams, Rohan Burgess and Daniel Mackrell.

The Kyabram Deakin Ward has five candidates - in ballot order, Neil Pankhurst, Vicki Neele, John Zobec, Russell Longuehaye-Hooper and Neil Repacholi. Three councillors have decided not to re-stand, Cr Carol Howell (Kyabram Deakin Ward), Cr Ian Maddison (Echuca Ward) and Cr Emma Bradbury (Echuca Ward).

The Victorian Electoral Commission (VEC) is conducting the elections. Ballot packs will be sent out for the Echuca Ward and Kyabram Deakin Ward between 4-6 October. Completed ballot material must be in the mail or hand-delivered to the VEC at 22 Sturt Street, Echuca by 6pm on Friday, 21 October. Due to longer delivery times through Australia Post, it is important to get completed ballot material returned as soon as possible.

The election will be declared by the VEC on Monday, 31 October. The new council will be sworn in at a special meeting on Tuesday, 8th November. Don't just say "They should be doing this or that" come along to the meeting and be part of "Doing this or that" with this hardworking committee.



Stanhope Cricket Club Welcomes English Recruits




