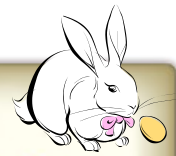

The service this year is to be held in Stanhope on **Sunday 23rd of April, commencing at 2.00 pm.**

This service is always held on the Sunday prior to Anzac Day.

The service will start with a short march from the Stanhope Community Hall to the War Memorial, a distance of about 200 metres.

Local Scouts will also take part in the March and act as Flag Bearers

Any ex-service persons or anyone who is a relative of ex-service persons are most welcome to join in the march.

The march will be accompanied by the Rushworth Concert Band, who will also play for the service in the Hall.

A short service, takes place at the War Memorial with one minutes silence, The "ode", "Last post" and "Reveille" played. The Catafalque Party will also be in attendance.

Members of the public and groups will then be invited to lay wreaths in honour of former service persons.

The March will return to the Community Hall where a further service takes place. This year the guest speaker is former Stanhope resident Flight Lieutenant Ross Mathieson, ex RAAF. Ross flew helicopters during the Vietnam War.

Local Historian John Hancox will have a display in the hall, including items from the Boer War, which he has collected over many years.

As the service concludes a collection will take place, and everyone is then invited to stay and have a chat while enjoying afternoon tea.

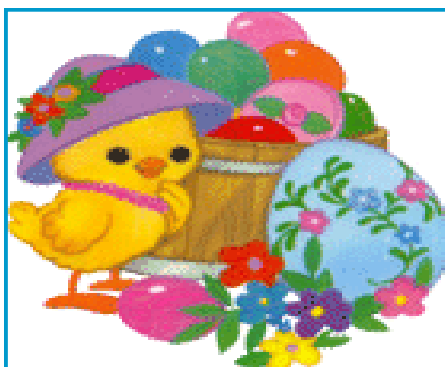

March Rainfall below average

Stanhope's rainfall for March was 29.8 mls being below the average of 36 mls.

Since rainfall records commenced in 1921 Stanhope has received no rainfall during March on 7 occasions.

The highest was received in 1950 when Stanhope received 256 mls.

Stanhope Fire Brigade Thermal Imaging Camera

The Stanhope Fire Brigade recently purchased a Thermal Imaging Camera with assistance from the Fire Brigade Auxiliary and the Stanhope & District Development Committee

This will be a very valuable piece of equipment for the Brigade, as it can find hot spots in buildings and fire grounds leading to less water being used and a more efficient know down time of a fire when the hot spots are not visible in normal operations.

The Camera can also detect unseen people in smoke. Training on this equipment has taken place and it can be used by other Brigades in emergencies.

Update on Cheese Factory Construction

Anticipation is building as construction on the Fonterra Stanhope multi-million dollar cheese-making facility enters the final stretch. As the countdown begins to the unveiling in mid-2017, Fonterra has created a series of videos to celebrate the site's progress and acknowledge the support of the townspeople who have rallied to help make it happen.

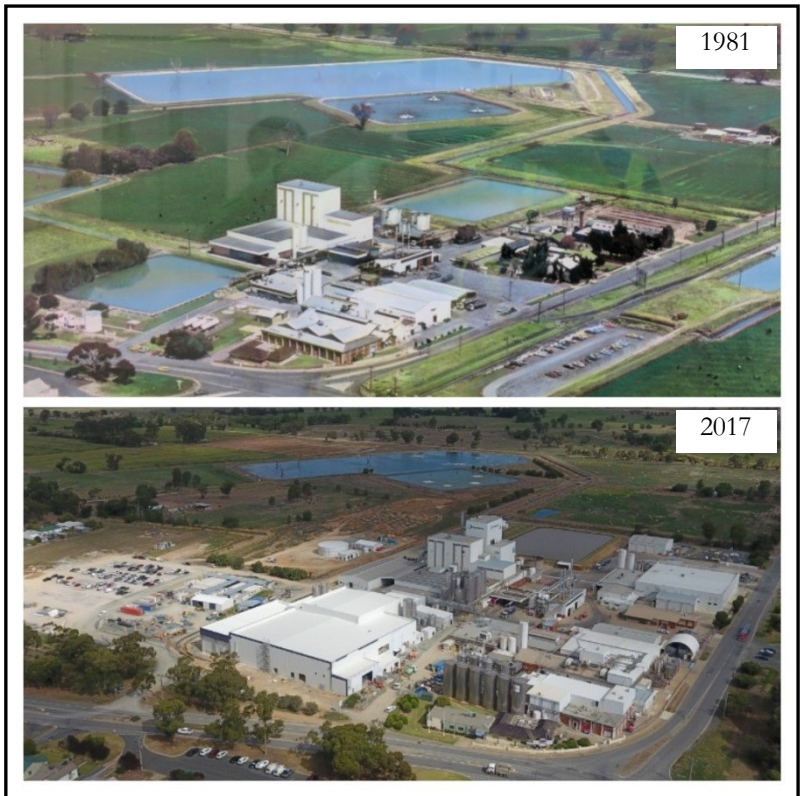
Fonterra Stanhope Site Manager Jason Wright recognises that the Stanhope site is indelibly linked to the town's identity and history, with a great sense of loss felt by the whole community when the previous hard cheese plant was destroyed by fire in December 2014.

"The impact of the fire was felt by everyone, not just on site, but throughout the whole region. Stanhope was chosen as Australia's Legendary Capital in 2015, and it truly is the heart of dairy country. It was the support of our townspeople that kept us going through the tough times, and we want to say thank you for that support. The town is absolutely buzzing at the moment – the plant can be seen rising from the ashes and everyone wants to know how construction is progressing."

"We hope some of these videos will show the community what's been going on behind the fences and give them a taste of what's to come," said Jason. The videos can be viewed at the Stanhope Business Centre or by checking out our [Legendairy Stanhope Mural](#) Facebook page.

As many in the community are aware, the northern wall of the new cheese factory will also feature a massive photo mosaic mural comprising thousands of images collected from the community themed "Proud People, Proud Community". Fonterra would like to thank everyone who has submitted photos – it's been marvellous and we've received some wonderful images.

Fonterra Photography Workshop



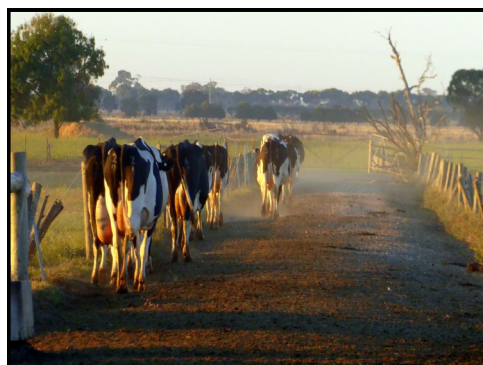

Obituaries

Tom Ryan

Tom Ryan, one of Stanhope's best known and most respected residents passed away early last month.

Tom was born in Port Lincoln S.A. on 7th November 1924, the second youngest of eight children, five boys and three girls.

It was at the Port Lincoln High School where he first started playing footy. When he left school he went to Adelaide and was apprenticed as a sheet metal worker, where he worked until 1948.

Tom played football for South Adelaide before coming to Victoria to try his luck with South Melbourne, where he played a number of games with and against some of the best footballers of those days, including Brownlow medalists.

It was while playing with South Melbourne, Tom met and married Wilma Johnston in 1951. They had four children, two girls and two boys. Gail, Raelene, Michael and Shane. Wilma had a stroke in 1993 and died nine months later

Move to Stanhope

Tom came to Stanhope in 1953 to coach the local football team for the next three years. During this time he worked at Heppell's Emporium, before taking up share farming. He share farmed in Hadfield's Road for Jim Martin, but eventually bought the farm. The four children all attended Stanhope Primary School before completing their education at Rushworth High School.

Community Involvement

Tom Ryan became a leader of the Stanhope Community, serving on numerous committees and being involved in many projects.

Apart from his involvement with the Stanhope Football Club, he was one of the original Polo Cross players when Stanhope fielded a Polo Cross team. He sold the farm in 1995 and moved into the town, where he took up bowls and later joined the bowls club committee.

He was also a member of the Recreation Reserve Committee, the Swimming Pool Committee, Swimming & Life Saving Club Committee and the Mardi Gras Committee.

Tom Ryan was a most highly respected and admired person by everyone who knew him. He will be sadly missed.



Clive Legge

Joseph Clive Legge known to all as Clive was born on 23rd November 1931 in Pambula, NSW.

Clive moved to Stanhope to live with his sister Frances, where at a family gathering he met the love of his life, Lorna. They married on the 21st of May 1955 at St Matthews Church of England, Stanhope.

This happy union produced 4 daughters, Barbara, Sandra, Ann & Carol. Sadly Sandra passed away at infancy. The family soon grew to include 3 sons in law, 9 grandchildren and 19 great grandchildren. Clive and Lorna knew the secret to a happy marriage and were lucky enough to celebrate their 60th wedding anniversary in 2015.

Clive worked the majority of his life at the Stanhope milk factory where he travelled many a country road driving a milk tanker. He also worked inside the factory, finishing his final years in the laboratory. Clive also enjoyed being involved with the Fire Brigade and Bowling Club.

Clive was a quiet, reserved, strong, but cheeky man, of very few words. He loved doing the rounds of the vintage engine and machinery rallies. He would load his trailer with his many restored stationary motors. His love of tinkering extended further than his motors as he took on the role of the family handyman.

Clive was regularly found behind the camera, capturing all those treasured memories of his beloved family. No event or milestone ever passed without Clive being there with his camera capturing these moments. Memories we will continue to love through his many slides and photos.

Clive leaves behind a loving family who will miss him dearly. A gentle nature, a heart of gold, these will be the memories we will forever hold.

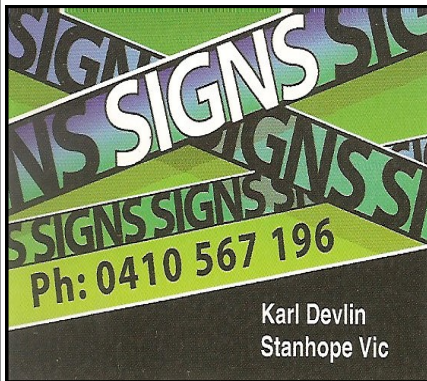
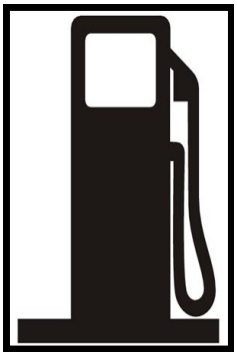


