

WH Emmett Family Celebrates 100 years at Shenstone

Not even the cold weather and rain could dampen the spirits of many family members who attended the 100-year reunion held at Gordon & Lyn Emmett's property on Sunday May 28th.




Sixty-eight descendants from WH Emmett (Bill), attended on the day. Bill first applied for the Closer Settlement Property, known today as 'Shenstone', on May 28th 1917. Bill & his wife Sylvia along with 12 children settled and operated the property until Bills death in 1941. The farm was then operated by Ivor and Malcolm, (Mac) who had to leave school. Mac & Ivor purchased an allotment each with Mac taking over Shenstone. Their mother Sylvia passed away in 1969.

In 1953 Mac married Angela and had 5 children, Gordon, Bill, Colin, Sue & Daryl. After leaving school at 16 Gordon came home to help Mac & Angela run the farm, followed by Colin a few years later.

Following the marriages of Gordon & Colin in 1981-82, the family purchased another property in Morrissey Road where Colin milked half the herd and Gordon & Lyn with their 3 children, Scott Marcus & Craig stayed on at Shenstone continuing the farm.

In 1987, Mac & Angela retired with Gordon & Lyn purchasing 74 acres of Shenstone, then in later years purchased Ivor's property of 42 acres next door, adjacent to the town, followed by the other 60 Acres where Mac & Angela lived in retirement.

Fonterra Update

It's time for Big Cheese

June has finally arrived!! It's been a little over 12 months of construction to date, with more than 300 contractors on site during that time to create the impressive structures that now take pride of place at the Stanhope factory. It's not finished yet but it has been exciting to take the community and our employees along for the ride so far – sharing updates and stories from the factory and about the project in the About Town each month.

This month we enter the commissioning phase of the project. That means it is time to start making cheese in Stanhope again.

A number of visitors will be attending the factory in late May and early June to make sure we have the tick of approval from the relevant quality, food safety and environmental authorities. Following this important step, we will start running milk through the processing equipment in small batches. First we plan to make some good old fashioned cheddar, followed by parmesan, gouda and low fat cheddar. All going well, we anticipate full production in place by August.

In the meantime, the site continues with finishing touches around the outside of the building. Walls are being painted, the gateways have been sealed and road works almost complete. For those who may have already noticed we even updated the Fonterra logo on the top of the dryer building. The mural is on track for installation in winter and we have started making plans for a community open day to be held once the weather gets a bit warmer.

2017 Tertiary Scholarship Winner




