Fonterra West Road – Drone Survey



Earlier this year Nick Buzza (President of the Rushworth Historical Society), accompanied by local Stanhope resident George Gemmill, visited Bakers Farm to take some photos

using a drone. Nick teaches short courses in GIS, GPS and UAV applications at the Riverina Institute of TAFE and has worked in the spatial industry for over 20 years.

Many local residents are aware of the salt-based stockpile currently stored at our West Road property given it is visible when driving north from Rushworth to Stanhope. We used Nick's expertise in deploying his drone to assess the overall mass of the stockpile. Nick produced a digital elevation model (see image below) from the drone photos and calculated an indicative volume.

The information that Nick put together will be combined with scientific data to assist us in planning how we gradually dispose of this material over the longer term.

We would like to extend our gratitude to Nick for his interest and assistance. .

Thank you to those who completed the questionnaire that was distributed in November 2017.



The results of the survey were reviewed by the members of the Stanhope STANHOPE Health Governance Committee at the March meeting. Approximately 530 STANHOPE HEALTH questionnaires were distributed to residents of Stanhope, Girgarre and surrounding areas. We received a total of 40 responses. The small number of responses makes it difficult to draw definitive conclusions.

Craig's 2018 UDV New Zealand Tour

On February 18th, Craig Emmett joined 6 other participants on the Gardiner Foundation 2018 New Zealand Study Tour. The Group along with UDV policy councillor Matt Gleeson, toured the South Island of New Zealand exploring farming systems, industry structures and discussing dairy with the locals. The tour is an innovative leadership initiative organised by the United Dairy farmers of Victoria.

Day 1: After landing in Christchurch NZ, the crew got to know each other over dinner before heading off on their tour.

Day 2: Visiting 2 dairy farms one being a 5th generation dairy farmer, the other milking over 1050 cows followed by a jet boat trip at the Rakaia Gorge.

Day 3: Visit to Farming Federation of NZ to discuss the NZ dairy industry with FNZ representative addressing labour shortages, more training opportunities through apprentices and succession planning.

Day 4 – After a cyclone we were greeting with raging rivers and flooded road. Visited 3 large scale farming properties arriving in Dunedin for the night. 1 milking 1500 cows, then on to Rakaia Island (2600ha -1590 farmed) formed in the middle of the Rakaia River. The island being privately owned and converted it from sheep/beef into dairying including 4 internal rotary dairies. The 3rd was another family run business including dairy, cropping, vegetables, grazing and contracting and employed close to 100 people.

Day 5: The next farm we visited was owned by 8 shareholders and milked about 520 cows. Arrived in Invercargill Rao Bank branch to discuss all sorts of matters including land price, splitting equity equally amongst families and siblings as well as the support that the bank provides to farmers. We also visited the Livestock Improvement Corporation who represents 12000 shareholders, employing 700 full time staff all year round and at peak can have an additional 1000 staff members join, and exports to 40 countries across the world. 70 % of New Zealand's dairy herds are currently tested through their services.

Day 6: Explored the township of Invercargill. Visited a 202 hectare dairy farm in southland whose family run 4 farms in total milking 540 spring cows with 120 replacement heifers at peak. They run wintering free stall barn with a mixed feed of bailage and sugar beet. The next farm milked 500 cows

on 175 hectares with 90 hectares on lease.

Day 7: Visited a farm in the process of converting to Organic Farming. Visited roadside Raw Milk Vending machine, (this being illegal in Australia). The next farm was the Southern Dairy Hub, a state of the art milk metering gear and multiple drafting gates, with manicured laneways and perfect pastures. Very impressive setup. Then off "SHENSTONE" farm (not the Stanhope one,) to hear of his excellent insight into how he ran the business with his philosophies on how to ensure dairy farming in his region ran as efficiently as possible and getting the best return on your investment. To be a positive and open attitude. Then on to Queenstown for our final night.

Craig enjoyed it immensely and learnt a lot and recommends for anyone under 35 interested in applying for next years trip.



Stanhope Fuel Under New Management

Amongst further improvements planned is the upgrading of the driveway and the installation of illuminated signage.

The previous managers are now managing a BP Service station in Benalla.


Tom Burgess turns 80

Fire Restrictions ended in the Campaspe Shire at midnight on Tuesday 3rd April 2018.

This does allow land owners to burn without a permit however Local and State Laws Must be adhered too and a Zero tolerance to illegal and reckless burns still exists. Laws and guidelines to burn are available from the Fire Brigade, Shire of Campaspe and CFA Websites. Please see below the main and most important points for burning farm land etc. All burn offs are to be reported to the CFA Burn-Off notification line 1800 668 511 and to your Local CFA Brigade Captain, You have a minimum of 1000litres of water available to fight a fire if it escapes the control burn area and; you have 3 capable persons on site.

We at the Stanhope Fire Brigade understand that Burning farmland is essential to farming sustainability however our Volunteers don't want to be spending our valuable time extinguishing reckless burning activities because easy to follow guidelines have, at times been ignored.

A dry start to Autumn

Official rainfall for Stanhope during March was only 5.2 mls. making a total of only 31.6 mls for the year so far.

The average rainfall in Stanhope for March is 33.1 mls The highest was in 1950 when

Stanhope received 256 mls for March. However, there has been no rainfall recorded during March on six occasions

Green Thumbs by Helen for April

Autumn is a crucial feeding time. Gardenias are fed to fatten them up for winter. Citrus need a good feed before their main fruiting season. Daphne's will be flowering soon so they need a feed. Roses get their last feed for the season and it is a good idea to feed camellias and azaleas to encourage new growth. Pieris and Hellebores can also be fed. Use an organic based or slow release fertilizer with a high potassium content. This helps flowering.

Later in April is the ideal time to plant new plants. It is hoped that by then we will have had more rain and cooler days by planting then the plants have time to settle in before the cold winter days.

Buy deciduous trees at the end of April, this give you a chance to see the Autumn coloring you can expect in the future.

Time to plant spring flowering bulbs. A pot of miniature daffodils, the variety Tete -a-tete,a favourite of mine, will brighten up the garden when they flower in Spring. When planting bulbs it is best to remember to plant them twice as deep as the bulb is high and the same distance apart. Most bulbs are planted pointy end up, except ranunculus and anemone, they have the pointy end down!

Plant flowering annuals now for a colourful display in winter. Pansies, Primulas, Polyanthus and Cineraria can all be planted this month.

It is time to prune pelargoniums. They can be cut quite hard, it is best to leave one or two leaves!

Fruit fly are still rampant, so gather up any fallen fruit and dispose of in a plastic bag left in the sun for a few days to kill the larvae. I
