

### STANHOPE FIRE BRIGADE NEWS

Recently Stanhope Fire Brigade has attended a number of MVA's (Motor Vehicle Accidents) or vehicle related incidents. As most people are aware and do obey the law, there are still a few motorists who aren't slowing



down when passing Emergency Vehicles.

This is a reminder that you MUST slow down to 40kmh when passing any stationary or slowmoving Emergency Vehicle (Police, Fire, Ambulance, SES) when flashing Red and/or Blue lights or sounding an alarm. This law was set in place for our safety when helping the public. Please note that we do take rego numbers and pass onto Police if we believe you aren't doing the right thing.

We have also needed to attend local burn-offs of late due to some people still not registering their burns. Even though the Fire Danger Period is over you still need to register all burn-offs, including bonfires. It is extremely

easy and only takes a few minutes of your time.



The Junkestra Orchestra entertained the crowd, with a variety of homemade instruments under the


guidance of Graeme Leak.


