

# New Concept for Center in Palms Park to Be Outlined

**PALMS**—Another plan for a community building at Palms Park will be discussed at a neighborhood meeting Thursday, April 20.

Current plans replace an earlier proposal that was abandoned after community protest, said Councilman Zev Yaroslavsky, who called the meeting to get residents' reactions to the new plan.

The meeting will begin at 7 p.m. at Overland Avenue School, 10650 Ashby Ave.

"I encourage the residents of Palms Park area to attend the meeting," Yaroslavsky said, and offer their suggestions and advice to the Department of Recreation and Parks.

"Continued feedback from the neighborhood will assure that the

new structure will best meet the needs and desires of the community."

The facility, to be on the west end of the park, would encompass about 5,500 square feet, including a main meeting room, four club and crafts rooms and a stage. No indoor sports facilities are planned.

A 7,500-square-foot parking lot would be provided adjacent to the building.

The former plan included indoor sports facilities and no new parking, Yaroslavsky said.

Existing park buildings would be demolished and the grounds landscaped, he added.

The project, to cost more than \$500,000, would be financed from state park funds, he said.
