## Syndicate Formed to Take Over St. Louis Club, Reveals Report

ST. LOUIS, Nov. 27. (AP)—The Globe-Democrat tonight said a syndicate of ten sportsmen here, including George Sisler, has been formed to purchase the St. Louis Browns of the American League.

The paper said Sisler, a former Brown manager and one of the greatest first basemen in diamond history, and several others had already obtained an option on the club.

No attempt will be made by the syndicate, the paper stated, to buy Sportsman's Park, home grounds of the Browns and the St. Louis Cardinals, or other baseball property owned by the estate of the late Phil Ball.

Sisler and his partner in a softball venture here, Edward Marsh are understood to have originated the syndicate.
