

# CLUBS LOSE LIQUOR RIGHTS

## *Montmartre and To-To Among Thirty-two Places Denied Sales Permits Until 'Proper Showing' Made*

Thirty-two establishments in Los Angeles and vicinity, including many well-known Los Angeles clubs, are denied the privilege of selling liquors by the State Board of Equalization in a sheaf of orders received yesterday by Michael Connolly, chief investigator for the board for the southern district.

While the board's rulings apply, generally, to the permit requests received in the hurly-burly period in which the State Liquor Control Act was first put into effect, Investigator Connolly said the board's action means that the places must make a proper showing before they can obtain renewals.

Most of the places which were denied the privilege of selling beer and wines were listed as clubs and, generally, the board found that they were not truly clubs. In seeking renewals, the proprietors of the places will be obliged to show that their quarters are open to the public and that they comply fully with the law in other respects.

The Club Montmartre, 6757 Hollywood Boulevard; the To-To Club, 623 1/2 South Hill street; the Colony Club, 3084 Motor avenue; the United States Army and Navy Club, Inc., suite 3333, Biltmore, and numerous other places widely known to the public are among the places denied licenses.
