The UWYC 2018-2019 Grant Cycle is now OPEN!



Each year, United Way of Yavapai County has a window of time in which grant requests can be made. The United Way of Yavapai County 2018-2019 grant cycle has just opened. This program is open to 501(c)3 nonprofit organizations and must be used exclusively in Yavapai County.

The first step is to send a Letter of Intent (LOI) , explaining your program and how the program helps to reduce poverty in the categories of Health, Education or Income (Financial Stability) in Yavapai County. Your one-page LOI is due by July 10th. If approved, you will be sent a formal grant application directly.

The formal grant application will be due August 24th. Those agencies that are awarded will be announced at our September 13th Campaign Kickoff event at 5:00pm at the Holiday Courtyard in Prescott.

We are excited to partner with other local non-profits to help improve the lives of those in need in Yavapai County. Looking forward to hearing from YOU!

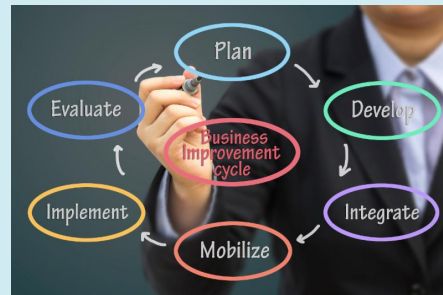
