## UWYC Grant funds new Job Readiness Program in Prescott

United Way of Yavapai County and the Yavapai County Contractors Association have teamed up to create a pilot project which will provide basic job training and certifications for those entering Annette Olson of UWYC presents grant check to Sandy Griffis of the Yavapai County Contractors Association the construction field. Program participants will attend classes on construction basics taught by company owners. The four week course will include topics such as labor, landscaping, pavers, concrete basics, and electrical training. Skills testing will help track and compare individual student performance results. The course includes basic OSHA and CPR certifications and drug screenings. Cerificates of completion will be awarded. NACOG (Northern Arizona Council of Governments) will partner also to assist in job placement, additional funding support and retention. Classes to begin in January.
