Living United, Changing Lives!



Prescott Area Shelter Services (PASS) provides temporary, emergency shelter to women and women with children in a 19 bed dormitory setting.

The shelter includes a community room, kitchen, two bathrooms and a conference room equipped with computers.

Shelter Guests may stay up to 90-Days with the opportunity to extend their stay if certain criteria are met. While at PASS, guests receive case management services and referral to valuable community resources. PASS is a Housing First program with over 90% of their guests transitioning into permanent housing!

The Prescott Area Women's Shelter was first opened in December 2007 as a winter shelter, and was located in the basement of the Hillside Church of God. Within four months of opening, the shelter provided services to 39 women and 7 children and over 20 faith-based and civic organizations provided 238 meals for our guests. At that time the shelter was staffed by 66 dedicated volunteers who covered every position necessary at the shelter. Despite it's modest accommodations, the shelter volunteers were able to help guests find places to stay, and to apply for jobs and government subsidies. In March of 2008, the last month the winter shelter would be open, it became clear that the community needed a year-round shelter to accommodate the many homeless women and children in Yavapai and surrounding counties.

In April 2008, the Prescott Area Women's Shelter moved into their current facility on 336 North Rush Street. The Prescott Area Women's Shelter is now named Prescott Area Shelter Services (PASS), a registered 501c3 organization.

We are proud to partner with Prescott Area Shelter Services. They change lives and improve the health and well being of many of our community members. Together, we are Living United!

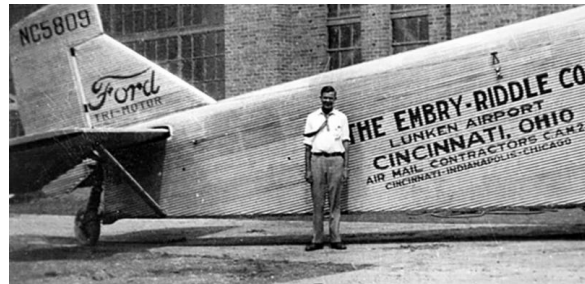


Donor In the Spotlight

EMBRY-RIDDLE Aeronautical University PRESCOTT, ARIZONA

The founders of Embry-Riddle were visionary entrepreneurs with dreams that gave rise to a reality bigger than their imaginations.

The Embry-Riddle Company was founded over 90 years ago to promote aviation through airmail carrier, aircraft sales, teaching the daring to fly, providing thrill rides, performing air shows, even transporting passengers on their scheduled mail routes.



From a desk in a hotel lobby, the company can be credited with operating the first air travel agency, having organized other mail carriers and selling their passenger space.

The Embry-Riddle story runs deep into the roots of aviation's history and today continues to expand its reach across various industries through its degree offerings and innovative research in the study of aerospace, in addition to the applied sciences, cyber-security, business, engineering, security and space.

At Embry-Riddle, our students are preparing to go out in the world and make an impact in their communities. But they don't have to wait until graduation to make a difference. Our students offer their time to opportunities such as Habitat for Humanity, the Salvation Army Angel Tree Campaign, local elementary schools, blood drives and Locks of Love.
