UWYC Partner Agency The Launch Pad Teen Center Gets New Digs for Spring Growth!



The Launch Pad will soon have a new home! Once renovated, the new two-story space will feature offices, meeting rooms, a tutoring space, and a conference room upstairs, with beautiful views of Thumb Butte. The first floor will include a non-profit coffee shop and snack bar, a game room, a large art studio, a stage, and several small group programming areas. The outside of The Launch Pad will include recreational space, learning space, a garden, and patio space. In the new location, The Launch Pad is

excited to build in sustainability through the non-profit coffee shop and the conference room. The conference room will be available for rent to community organizations and businesses, and the coffee shop and snack bar will be open to the community all day long. Teens who are interested can apply to participate in a paid apprenticeship program that will teach them how to run a small business and provide great customer service while delivering a high-quality product. This amazing apprenticeship program has been funded by **United Way of Yavapai County**. The Launch Pad is very thankful for the partnership they have with UWYC and the generous donors who give to make learning opportunities available for their teens.

None of this is possible until The Launch Pad raises all the necessary funds for the building project. While they currently own the building, it is truly a blank canvas. Events to help raise money for the build and for The Launch Pad's programs include The *Launch Into Summer Fashion Show* on May,17th, and *Trek for Teens Rim to Rim Hike* on October 5th. You can also buy a brick and have it custom engraved for the building entrance pathway for a gift of \$100.
