## Community Meal Tonight

Dear Family and Friends of Cedar Falls UCC,

Our Cedar Falls UCC Clothes Closet (Kaden's Kloset) had an open house Saturday January 21<sup>st</sup>. I give a big thanks to Colleen for coordinating the helpers and getting the closet ready for this event. We both want to thank all our volunteers for their help. The families that came in the morning had a nice opportunity to visit with each other. They all seemed interested in our opening our church up once a quarter or more often so they don't have to call ahead.

A couple of extra special blessings happened at our C.F.U.C.C. Clothes Closet open house. First the UNI student I mentioned in the last voice, Shannon, came at 9 a.m. and stayed until early afternoon. She is delightful. Second was a 10 year old (who had her birthday since the open house so is now 11) shared with us her project. She has a goal to provide a birthday celebration for children in foster care. She calls it birthday blessings. It includes a container about shoe box size with small plates, cups, napkins, balloons, party hats, blowers, candy, small birthday gifts (in a theme). Her 5<sup>th</sup> grade class will be making up more boxes in February. She has (on her own) completed and is now distributing 21 of them. We now can share with foster families, birthday blessings.

us get the word out that this closet is available for any foster families. And get the word out that we are welcome to all at church.

A challenge for all of us in 2017 is to look for the good news. People are working for a better world and we don't seem to be hearing about it in our regular news. We had a couple people share on the 22<sup>nd</sup> of January. They shared about the awesomeness of our country's changing leadership non-violently on Friday and then our freedom of speech with the women's march on Saturday that also was millions of people gathering all over the world non-violently. As a church, we are asking difficult questions. We are small and wanting to grow. A follow up item from this Annual Meeting is our church financial report. We utilized a \$76,000 endowment fund transfer last year. The endowment fund total only dropped from \$438,000 to \$414,000. We had a good return on investment for the year which really helped.

We have tentatively scheduled another Fireside Chat for after the service on February 26. We will have a fairly open agenda, but generally I'd like to again discuss opportunities for growth and any other thoughts the congregation may have.

### **Obituary for James (Bart) McAninch**

James Barton McAninch, 91 of Cedar Falls died peacefully on January 14, 2017. James ("Bart") was the son of Bertha Elizabeth (Overholser) and Ebon Merritt McAninch. He graduated from Mount Ayr (Iowa) High School and joined the [US Navy](#) in May, 1943. He received an honorable medical discharge, and enrolled at Iowa State University and earned his Bachelor of Science degree in forestry in 1948. On August 8, 1948 he married Marlys Blume. His working career was spent entirely with the U.S. Department of Agriculture; specifically with the US Forest Service in Washington and the Soil Conservation Service in Iowa. He retired in 1980.

He was a member of United Church of Christ-Cedar Falls, American Forestry Association, Prairie Rapids Audubon Society, Hartman Reserve Nature Center, and the National Association of Retired Federal Employees.

He is survived by his wife, Marlys; one daughter, Melinda (Gene) Grimm of Indianola, IA; three sons, Jay (Janet) of Centreville, VA; David (Kristine) of Green Bay, WI; Kurt (Ruth) of Pleasanton, CA; ten grandchildren and twelve great-grandchildren; one brother, Carroll Dean (Helen), of Lakewood, CO; several cousins, and nieces/nephews. He was preceded in death by his sister, Betty Jo, brother-in-law, Donald Barker of Las Vegas, NV and his parents.

## Social Justice Action Request

We have received several e-mail requests asking for our help to respond to different concerns. I will relay two of the requests from 2 different organizations that we have supported in the past. The first request is from Bread for the World. Here is that letter:

Dear Friend,

In 1990, President George H.W. Bush said "Immigration is not just a link to America's past, it's also a bridge to America's future." In 2017, that bridge is very much in danger.

**Please Call 800-826-3688 and tell your U.S. representative and your U.S. senators to co-sponsor the BRIDGE Act (H.R. 496/S.128).**

The BRIDGE Act would provide temporary relief from deportation to undocumented youth who qualify for the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program. These individuals were brought to the United States as children, and it is the only home they have ever known. They contribute to our community as valuable employees, veterans and students.

The BRIDGE Act would allow nearly 1 million undocumented young adults to continue to legally work and study in the U.S. while Congress debates legislation to fix our broken immigration system.

People without documentation are among the most vulnerable to poverty and hunger in our country. Scripture calls us to welcome the immigrant. Part of welcoming our brothers and sisters requires advocating for their well-being and dignity.

Please call your U.S. Representative and your U.S. Senators today! Urge your U.S. Representative and your U.S. Senators to co-sponsor the BRIDGE Act (H.R. 496/S.128). Thank you,

A request from NAMI:

Please call congress now to protect mental health care: Call 202-224-3121, press #2 and enter your zip code. Say something like: “As a constituent, I would like the Representative to protect people with mental illness who can’t afford to lose health coverage. Please preserve Medicaid and insurance safeguards that help people get mental health care. Thank you.”

If you could also call our Senators with the same message, 202-224-3121, press #1 and enter your zip code, this would be helpful too. Are you affected by health insurance issues and potential changes that may be coming? What about pre-existing conditions? Do you have someone this affects?

Congressional hearings are this week and the discussion of pros and cons about Medicaid and the health insurance marketplaces. Nearly 1 out of 3 people covered by Medicaid expansion live with a mental health or substance use condition. And people with marketplace insurance plans have fair and equal mental health coverage. With this coverage, people have access to mental health services that support recovery. Email and let our members of Congress know how these plans help.
