Lent Begins March 1st Ash Wednesday Service 5:30 p.m.

Dear Family and Friends of Cedar Falls UCC,

Lent begins Wednesday March 1st with an Ash Wednesday service at 5:30 p.m. The church will be open afterwards for those who would like to have quiet time, prayer time, or conversation with Pastor Sue. Beginning on March 5th (the 1st Sunday of Lent) we will have a prayer station set up for anyone who would like to have one on one prayer. If you need healing (physical, emotional, or spiritual) and can't make it to church, let me know and I will join with one other person to specifically pray for you. Prayer is important to me personally, but also to the life of the church. Do you have time in each day set aside for prayer? A lot of times prayer has been about our speaking to God saying what we want or need and even sometimes how we want it or feel we need it. Prayer is also listening. How do you listen to God?

During this Lenten Season, I invite you to focus on your own spiritual life. What needs your attention? Have you been ignoring an old hurt that has now festered or still causes you pain? Are you holding onto anger or hurt? What is draining you of energy? What keeps you from listening to God or to a loved one? What holds you back from the gift of today that life is giving? Do experience peace within? We have more pulls today that move us away from inner peace than we did when I was young. We have gotten good at making excuses and complaining. With

God's help we can make a change and be healthier in our spiritual lives. Since we are all connected that means we will be healthier as a community of faith also.

As a church, we are asking difficult questions. We are small and wanting to grow. What is keeping us from growing? There have been a couple of you who have been asking people you know that used to come here to come back. One response that has been given is that they are attending another church. A few responses have indicated that they still have strong feelings about what happened a few years back. Do you have any thoughts about what we could do to help the people that still have those hurt feelings? Would they be willing to have me visit with them with you? They may choose never to return to our church community, but perhaps we could bring healing to their life.

I would encourage any of you that may have reservations about seeing someone who used to go here to pray for healing of that relationship and talk about it. These things will prevent us from growing as a church as well as hinder individual's finding inner peace. We are a church. Do we believe in God's power to heal? Do we believe in God's love? Do we act on that love by forgiving others? By forgiving ourselves? Are we willing to listen to another's pain? Are we able to not judge? Are we truly ready to be the "new creation" that God is inviting us to be?

What does this look like? What are we willing to risk? What are we willing to let go of?

One of the questions we need to be in agreement about is for what purpose are we a church in this time and in this place. What in the world are we doing here? Who are we today? I don't think we are of one mind about this. For some this is the church they have known and been a part of all their life or much of their life. These persons want it to continue as it did. For some this is the place they have friends and they just want to enjoy them. What is it for you?

You have a vision statement and a mission statement. Do you know what they say? How are we living them? How are we not living them?

The prophet Micah answers what God requires of us and could be why we are here: to do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with God. All three together reflect our relationship with God and our purpose in being. Who we are today will be reflected in how we live this out in our life together.

We are making a difference where we can and how we can. You can make the church stronger. Invite and bring friends to worship. God bless you! God is awesome! God loves you!

Obituary for James (Bart) McAninch

James Barton McAninch, 91 of Cedar Falls died peacefully on January 14, 2017. James ("Bart") was the son of Bertha Elizabeth (Overholser) and Ebon Merritt McAninch. He graduated from Mount Ayr (Iowa) High School and joined the [US Navy](#) in May, 1943. He received an honorable medical discharge, and enrolled at Iowa State University and earned his Bachelor of Science degree in forestry in 1948. On August 8, 1948 he married Marlys Blume. His working career was spent entirely with the U.S. Department of Agriculture; specifically with the US Forest Service in Washington and the Soil Conservation Service in Iowa. He retired in 1980. He was a member of United Church of Christ-Cedar Falls, American Forestry Association, Prairie Rapids Audubon Society, Hartman Reserve Nature Center, and the National Association of Retired Federal Employees. He is survived by his wife, Marlys; one daughter, Melinda (Gene) Grimm of Indianola, IA; three sons, Jay (Janet) of

Centreville, VA; David (Kristine) of Green Bay, WI; Kurt (Ruth) of Pleasanton, CA; ten grandchildren and twelve great-grandchildren; one brother, Carroll Dean (Helen), of Lakewood, CO; several cousins, and nieces/nephews. He was preceded in death by his sister, Betty Jo, brother-in-law, Donald Barker of Las Vegas, NV and his parents.
