Dear Family and Friends of Cedar Falls UCC,

Praise God! Today my heart is full of thank-full-ness for this community. We are having meaningful conversations on Wednesday night on a variety of topics. Rev Janice Springer has led another useful and insightful workshop on Prayers of Hands and Heart (October 14<sup>th</sup>). Thank you Janice. Thank you Dick Douglas for sharing your faith story on Sunday October 15<sup>th</sup>. I appreciated what Dick said and if you weren't able to be in worship but would like to listen...see him share, I made a DVD of his sharing. I have now available all those who have shared a part of their faith story on DVD. Celeste, Greg, myself, Janice and Dick sharing is now available.

On "Spirit" Day – a day to show support of the LGBTQ folk – I was asked to be on a panel at Wartburg to field any faith/religion questions the audience might have for the panel. So on October 19<sup>th</sup>, at 6:30 p.m. I joined 5 other panel members and the Transcend founder as moderator. The evening started with a presentation about what different terms mean around Transgender issues. 75 – 100 different audience members were present. Because people were free to come and go, I'm not sure how many people actually came to the event. It was an opportunity to let those there that I believe that we are all God's children and are called to accept people wherever they are on life's journey and encourage one another to grow on our relationship with the divine. By the responses I got (mostly after the event) people were appreciative that there were churches who would welcome them or their families.

The United Church of Christ has launched a new partnership invitation to all our churches. At the last General Synod they began the "3 Great Loves" initiative –an initiative that focuses on

Love of Neighbor, Love of Children, and Love of Creation. "...And the greatest of these is love." (–a quote from 1 Corinthians 13:13) There may be no greater calling in today's ministry than the call to love. 3 Great Loves is a denomination-wide effort that about engaging the UCC to take action and to show the impact of the UCC, working together as one church, with one voice and one vision – a vision of A Just World for All.

Our General Minister and President, John C. Dorhauer, invites us to consider supporting the 3 Great Loves initiative over the next 2 years by planning activities around the following time line for each of the Loves: 1. NOW through the Spring of 2018 – Love of Neighbor: whether it is a neighbor in need who lives next door or on the other side of the world, many are faced with the need for protection, shelter, and support. 2. Summer 2018 – Winter 2019 – Love of Children: children in many families and neighborhoods need school supplies to overcome inequalities in our education systems. 3. Spring of 2019 – Love of Creation: taking care of our environment is one of the most important responsibilities we have as the Church.
