## Happy Thanksgiving

Dear Family and Friends of Cedar Falls UCC,

We also remembered others who were no longer members of this congregation but had been. We also acknowledged other personal losses of those present. God has blessed us and remembering with love those who have been a blessing to us helped us.

#### Our prayers continue for these families and all those who have lost loved ones.

I am doing a series in worship on how many scriptures talk about how we are to relate to "one another." The first one I lifted up was praying for "one another." It is my hope that all of us remember to pray for "one another." I know there is a lot going on in many of your personal lives. Know I hold you in prayer and will make myself available if you just need to talk. On the 11<sup>th</sup> of November, we talked about comforting one another, bearing one another's burdens, and being hospitable with one another without complaining.

Part of the reason I am doing this series of sermons is to remind us all that the Christian walk is a shared journey. Sometimes it is helpful to remember that we do not walk alone when we are part of a Christian community. We are interrelated and interdependent. Paul shared with the early Christian communities that when one member suffers all suffer together; if one member suffers all suffer together; if one member is honored, all rejoice together (1 Corinthians 12:26).

Paul worked with the various Christian communities. The Greek word used to describe the shared life of the people of God was koinonia. Koinonia means sharing, all kinds of sharing: sharing in friendship (Acts 2:42), being partners in the Gospel (Phil.1:5), sharing material possessions (2 Cor. 8:4), having fellowship in Christ (1 Cor. 1:9), and sharing life together in the Spirit (2 Cor. 13:14).

Above all, koinonia is fellowship with God. Because we belong to Christ, we belong to each other. In koinonia we are bound to each other, to Christ, and to God. Our life is a shared life, we hear one another's burdens. A factor crucial to living this shared life in Christ or koinonia is "Listening." The kind of listening I'm talking about is listening to one another with our hearts. When we listen with our hearts, we convey to the one being heard that they are valued, important, and are worthy. An important aspect of our listening is how we extend an extravagant welcome to those who come in our midst.

Martin Buber, a great Jewish thinker, spent his life seeking to share with others the importance of relations between I and Thou. For the clue to this meaning he referred to the role of Spirit. "Spirit is not in the I but between the I and Thou." This is one sentence with a world of meaning. The Spirit is known in relationship - Buber would say only in relationship. When we listen with love, the sharing moments are holy and the Spirit open doors, hearts, and effects change. When we listen to one another we don't have to have "answers", the Spirit moves each of us until an answer is revealed within each of us. When we are available to each other – we are available in love - bearing one another's burdens.

We have been getting comments by our visitors that they have felt welcomed and cared about. God's love through this congregation is shining into the community.

God bless you! God is awesome! God loves you!
