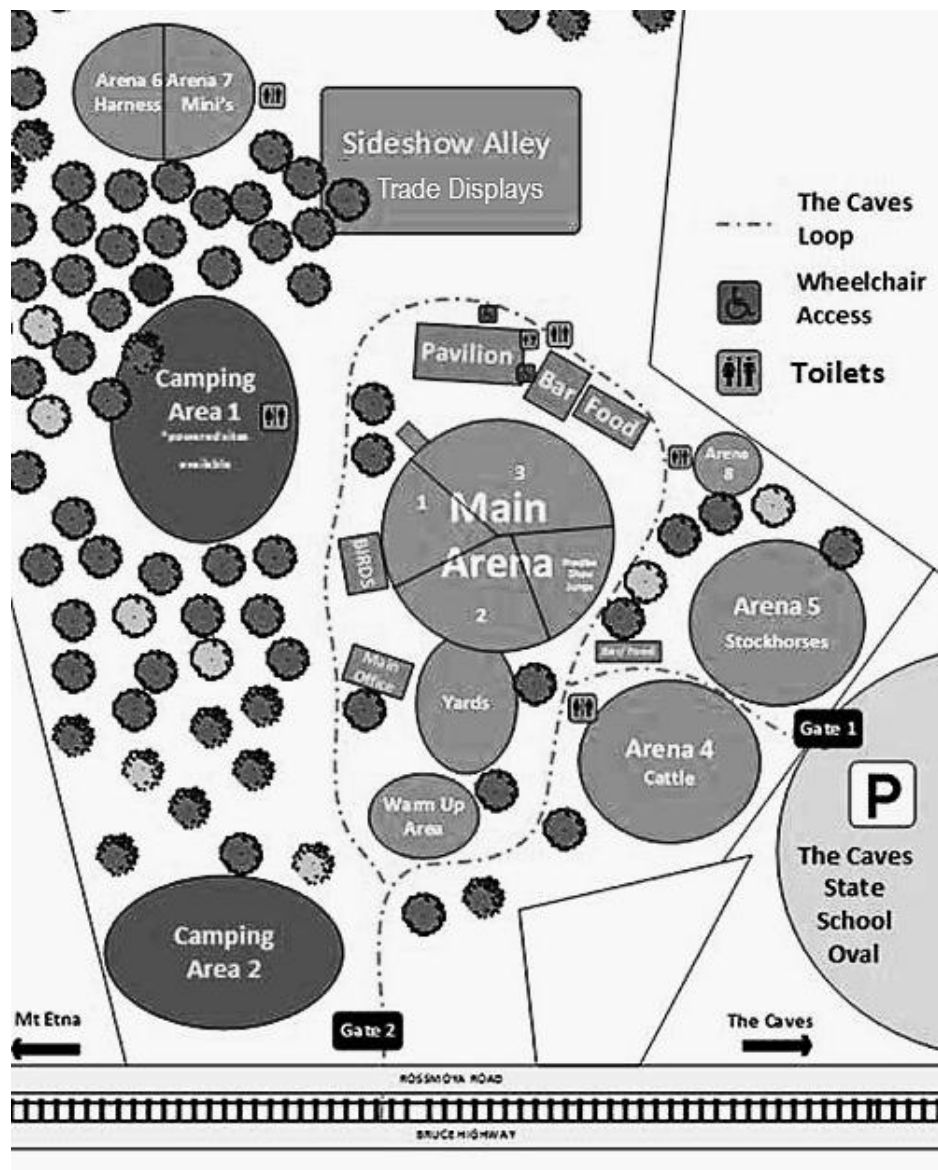

Biosecurity Requirements

It is a condition of entry that exhibitors maintain good biosecurity practices whilst at the event and comply with the following requirements:

- All livestock MUST be in good health, eating normally and not shown signs of illness or disease, at least 3 days prior to and on arrival at The Caves Show 2019.
- All livestock MUST arrive clean and free of organic material.
- All vehicles and equipment must arrive clean and free of organic material (eg. excess manure and mud) that could contain disease or pests.
- Any signs of disease at the event must be reported to a steward, and if deemed necessary examined by the on-call veterinarian at the owner's expense.
- In the event of a suspected livestock disease, exhibitors must follow any instructions given by a steward. If directed, livestock will be moved to an onsite quarantine facility for testing and/or treatment.
- In the event of any livestock movement restrictions, the exhibitor is responsible for the care, maintenance and cost of livestock including feeding and watering for the duration of the restriction

Main Arena Event Rules

- By entering any event Exhibitors and Competitors agree to be bound by these Rules.
- The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry.
- The Committee reserves the right to disqualify and bar any competitor who breaches these rules and require the return of any awards and prizes.
- The Committee reserves the right to substitute prize money for an item of equal or greater value.
- The Committee's and/or Judge's decision is final.
- The Show is EA affiliated, the EA Nat. Show Horse Rules & Guidelines apply to all hack events.
- Classes may be varied at the Chief Steward's discretion.

Entries & Eligibility

- Proof of age of junior competitors will be required. Please have valid proof of age available for rider classes. (E.g. Student Card or copy of Birth Certificate).
- Proof of horses' height may be requested. Please have height certificates available. Horses may be measured for height at the Chief Steward's discretion.
- There will be no refund on entry fees for missed classes.
- A Maiden is a horse that has not won a first prize in a similar event at an affiliated show.
- A Novice is a horse that has not won a Championship at any Agricultural Show, or a Championship at an EA affiliated show or has not won a first at a Royal Show.
- Stallions are not permitted in ridden Hack classes.
- Stallions are eligible for all led classes, western and working horse classes.
- A Galloway Hack shall be over 14 hands and not exceed 15 hands.
- Horses competing in specific breed classes must be registered with their respective breed society and proof of registration and current membership must be produced on demand.
- No person under the age of 17 years is to handle a stallion.
- All riders must wear protective head-gear to the current Australian Standard or better whilst riding anywhere on the show grounds.
- The helmet retaining harness must be secured and fastened at all times that the rider is on the horse.
- All riders must wear suitable riding boots that are heeled and soled, with little or no tread, at all times when riding anywhere on the show grounds.
- Electric fences are only allowed in designated areas and must be sign posted.

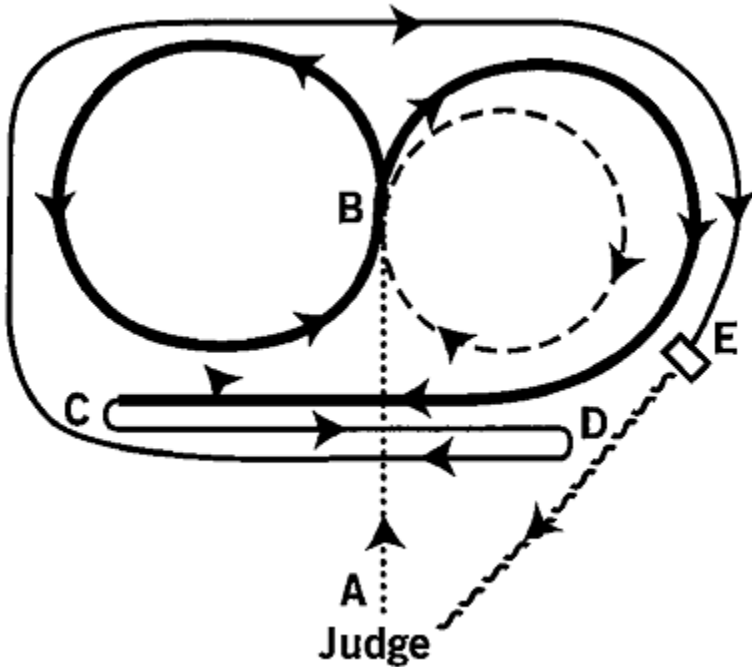

7. Walk to judge on loose rein

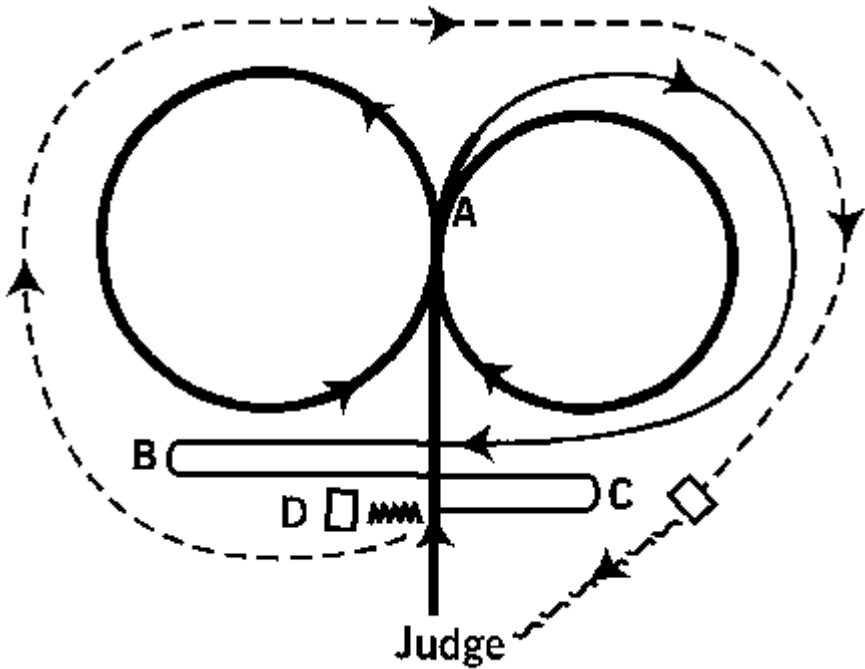

7. At E Stop, settle and Walk back to Judge on a loose rein.

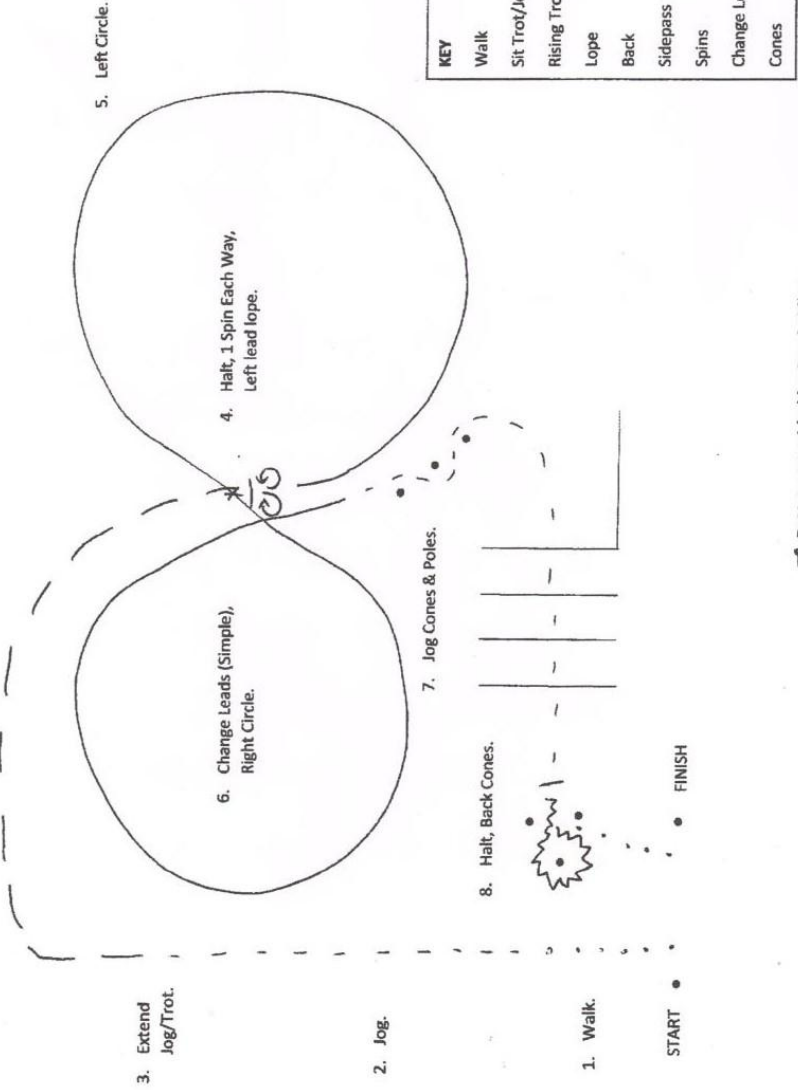

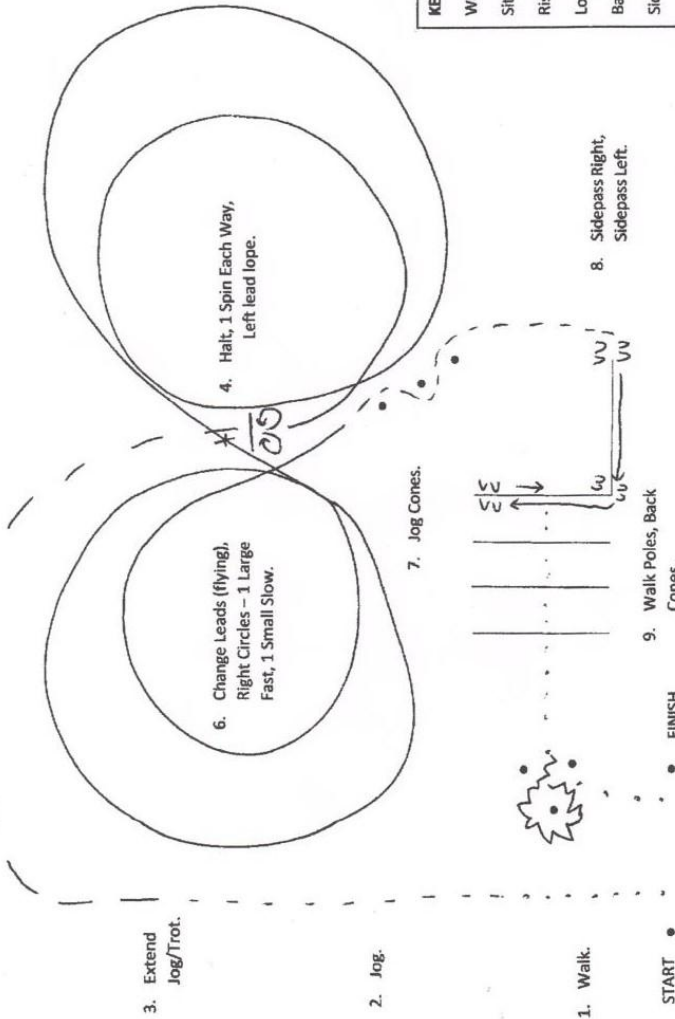

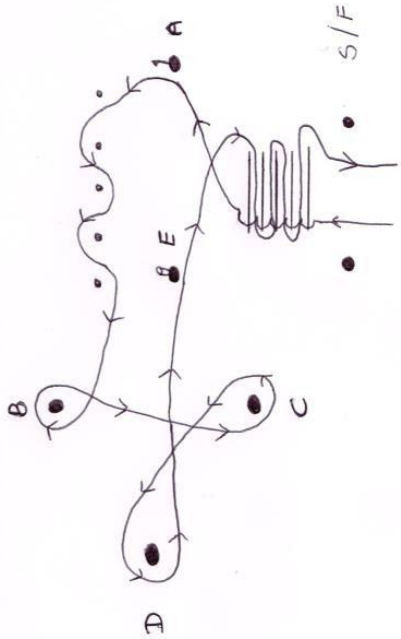
Time Trial

Course

1. Start course at Start / Finish Pegs
2. Jump line of 5 jumps
3. Proceed to drum 'A', pick up flag
4. Bend through pegs starting with first peg on your right
5. Proceed to drum 'B' making a clockwise turn around drum
6. Proceed to drum 'C' making an anti-clockwise turn around drum
7. Proceed to drum 'D' making an anti-clockwise turn around drum
8. Proceed to drum 'E', put flag in bucket
9. Return by bending through jumps starting with the first jump on your right
10. Finish course through Start / Finish pegs

Rules

1. Knocking over a drum or peg will result in a 5 second penalty per drum / peg.
2. If flag is dropped rider must dismount, pick up flag, remount and can then continue course.
3. Error of course will result in elimination.

1. Cattle age as at 1st April 2019.
2. Cattle over 12months to wear nose ring.
3. All cattle must be dehorned or poll.
4. The Committee reserves the right to amalgamate classes if necessary
5. Exhibitors group to consist of three animals bred by the exhibitor with both male and female progeny exhibited.
6. Dam's progeny classes to be two progeny of the dam.
7. Sire's progeny classes to be three progeny of one sire with both male and female progeny exhibited.

Biosecurity Requirements

- Cattle MUST be tagged with an NLIS device.
- NLIS scanning will be 7am.
- National Cattle Health Declarations to be handed in during NLIS scanning. Exhibitors are NOT required to hand in their movement record (NVD / Waybill).
- Johnes Beef Assurance Score – It is the exhibitors' responsibility to manage their herds risk to Johnes Disease.
- All exhibitors MUST adhere to 'The Caves Show Biosecurity Requirements' on page 7 of the program

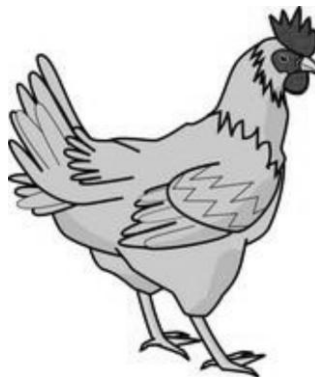

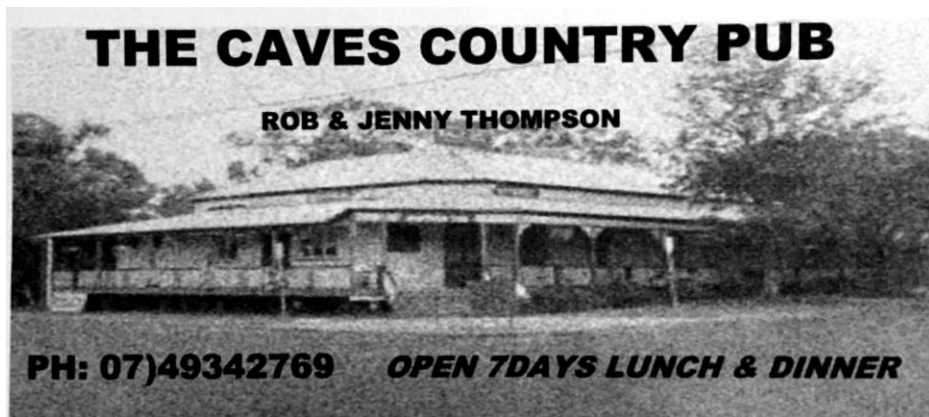

Fruit Cake Recipe

Ingredients:

1kg mixed fruit	200g glazed cherries
1/2 cup of rum or brandy	250 g butter
250g brown	1 teaspoon grated lemon rind
1 teaspoon vanilla	2 tablespoons marmalade
1 teaspoon parisian essence	4 eggs
2 cups plain flour	1/2 cup self-raising flour pinch salt
1teaspoon mixed spice	1/4 teaspoon each of nutmeg and cinnamon

Method

1. Chop fruit, cover with spirits and stand overnight.
2. Cream butter and sugar with vanilla essence, add marmalade and parisian essence.
3. Add 1 egg at a time beating well, fold in prepared fruit alternately with dry ingredients, and mix well.
4. Fill in an 8 inch square tin, lined with 2 layers of baking paper. Bake in a slow oven until cooked.

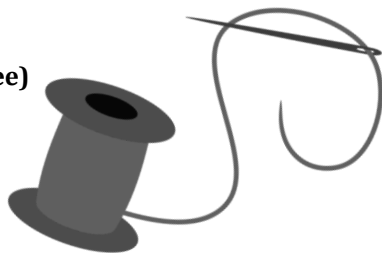

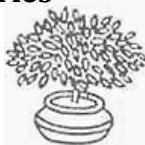

Giant Pumpkin Growing Tips:

Plant your Atlantic Giant Pumpkin (*Cucurbita maxima*) seed in late Spring.

-  Your pumpkin patch should be well drained, spacious and sunny but well protected. The ground should be prepared and turned with manure or other types of food to give nourishment and compost.
-  Be sure to fertilize and water regularly – but don't over water as it may rot. Your pumpkin has a lot of growing to do, so fertilize weekly with liquid manure or liquid compost.
-  Once established, prune back your vine to one fruit.
-  A giant pumpkin takes approximately five months to grow – about 70-90 days before fruit appears on the vine and another 60 days or so for the fruit to mature.
-  The fruit matures in Autumn – just in time for the Caves Country Show!!
