## CLUB ACTIVITIES NOV AND OCT

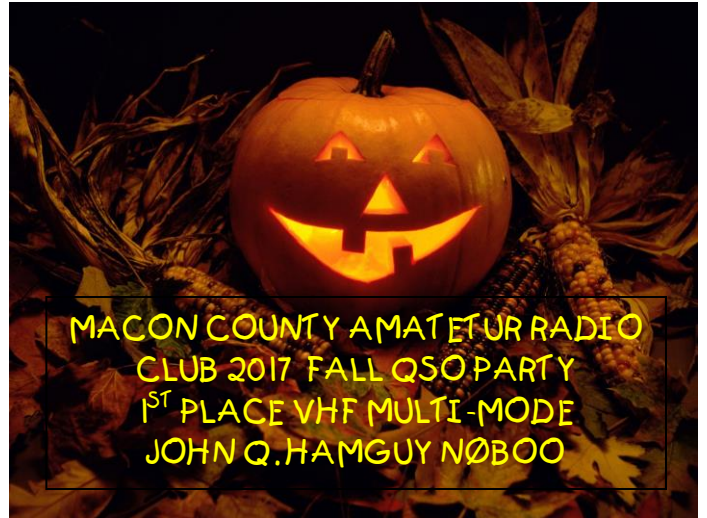
