Aqua Marine



AQUAMARINE:
The name *aquamarine* is derived from the Latin word *aqua*, meaning water, and *marina*, meaning *the sea*. This gemstone was believed to protect sailors, as well as to guarantee a safe voyage. The serene colour of aquamarine is said to cool the temper, allowing the wearer to remain calm and level-headed. Its pale, cool colour beautifully complements spring and summer wardrobes. Aquamarine is most often light in tone and ranges from greenish blue to blue-green; the colour usually is more intense in larger stones. This gemstone is mined mainly in Brazil, but also is found in Nigeria, Madagascar, Zambia, Pakistan, and Mozambique

From the Presidents Desk

Thankyou to all the members who have voted me in to be the new President.

It will be a pleasure and an honour to work alongside all of you great folks.

I don't have any huge designs of Grandeur for the club, but it would be great to get the whole place cleaned up and re-arranged to make best use of the available space that we have.

After doing a 'costing exercise' on the proposed 'entry extension' it is not going to be a viable project. Although it is only a small building, it still has to go through all the building regulations and various processes and will end up costing in excess of \$10,000. This money, we feel will be better spent on improvements within the club house itself.

The proposed addition of the 'new room' within the Saw room is a great idea, but after getting feedback from members and giving it more thought I think we can do better to utilise what we have. Freda has also given us some good insight into what would be best for the silver workshop layout.

We have recently made 2 x Grant Applications.

The first one is to the RSL for \$5,000 towards a new 23" slab saw .(which is \$9,000 in total). However, we don't hold out much hope for this one because the RSL have hundreds of applications, and I am pretty sure, because they paid for a new faceting machine last year, they will not want to include us again this year.

The second Application is to the

Sunshine Coast Council for 'Major improvements Grant'. We have applied for a \$7,500 grant towards our planned improvements. The grant application requires a letter explaining why the money is required and how it will benefit the community, so let's hope we have got it right. Keep everything crossed !!

Before we start on any big improvements in the club house, we really need to sort out the 'council storeroom' in the main pavilion. The place is so untidy, it needs stripping out completely, a new high level shelf (floor) added and as much shelving as we can get in there. If we keep everything 'mobile' and 'free standing' we have no need to get councils approvals for anything.

Although it appears to be 'choc o block' at present, there is actually plenty of room in there for everything. Hopefully we can also move more stuff out of the club house ready for the improvements to start. (like the mine Cart and Gem fest stuff)

A working bee is planned for Saturday 16th April. So hopefully if you can spare some time to give a hand to help out that would be great. Trevor said he has some shelving left over from his camping store which he is happy to donate, so this will be very useful.

A new 'Sign in' desk has been installed in the clubhouse, which also includes members paperwork and information, more info about this is on a later page.

Extra tools and materials have been purchased for the up and coming 'silver course'. Thanks to John Huelin, Freda and Bernadette. It is scheduled to start in a couple of weeks' time. They al-

ready have 5 people signed up and others are in the pipeline. I reckon it will be fantastic;

Everyone has put a lot of planning into it. If you miss out on this one there will be another one as soon as we get the numbers.

We thought the Caravan, camping, boating and fishing show would put the 'mockers' on the workshop sessions this week and next, (as it has in previous years) but the security people have provided perimeter fencing around the venue whilst leaving access for us and the tennis people. So that is great. Thanks to the showground management.

Don't forget the Monthly meeting on Wednesday 13th April at 7.00pm. Everyone is welcome to attend to keep up to date with club activities. New ideas are always welcome, and offers to help and do jobs are even more welcome.

The Club has just renewed their Fossicking Licence, which is available for all members to use. Remember though, you still need owners permission if on private land.

Congratulations to Derek and Mavis Hill who celebrated their 60th Wedding Anniversary on March 17th (St Patricks Day).

invited members to his home to enjoy his large collection of rocks and minerals, many of which he found over years of fossicking.


Taking new members under his wing, Ed taught the art of cutting and polishing, faceting and setting beautiful rocks and gems. To which Ed himself is a true gem.
