

From the Presidents Desk

There is plenty to Report over the last couple of months, at the club.

We had a great working Bee last month, cleaning out the Council Storeroom, installing extra shelves and making everything accessible.

We figured it would be best to get this sorted out before we attempted any work in the Clubhouse itself.

There is now more space available to move a lot of Surplus materials and equipment from the clubhouse. This has already been started.

We had a great donation from an Ex member, Bob Ellis, who unfortunately is in a Nursing home and not very well. His daughter Yvette called and offered the equipment to the club which we gladly accepted.

We also purchased some equipment from Patrick English who was a previous president.

Patrick has also donated his rock collection which is close to half a ton of fine looking rocks.

The Silver Course has been a resounding success Thanks to John Huelin and Freda. They extended the course period from 4 to 6 weeks to give everyone chance to complete their projects. We have all learned a lot from this, and look forward to organising another course down the track

Unfortunately we didn't get the grant for the Slab saw from the RSL. However this was not unexpected as we had a grant last year from them, and there is a huge amount of applications. Next year we will try again.

THE GOOD NEWS IS.... We got the Grant from the Council for our improvements. \$7,500, Everyone is 'stoked' and it is a great relief to

know that we can make our improvements without dipping into our Savings.

It has been deemed that we do not need any 'building regulation approvals' for our works, but because we are now leasing the building from the Council, we need 'Lessors approval' for the minor works. This has already been applied for, and it should be just a formality.

We have already measured up for the new benches and tables and John Huelin has had the steel for the framework delivered to his workshop/home at Eumundi. Pep lives nearby and is giving John some help to make them.

In the interim we are slowly clearing out the Saw room in readiness for the new benches.

This is just the start and we are looking forward to getting stuck into the rest.

The saw room will be a bit disorganised for a while with stuff sitting on the floor, until we get the new benches made. We will endeavour to keep the saws operational in the meantime.

Laurie Jones has kindly offered to take the Large Vibrating lap home to polish slabs.

This is a great machine, and works very well. Unfortunately we can't use it at the Club house as it need constant attention and needs to run all day. So it only gets used when we get volunteers. John Craine and I have had it previously.

We do have another smaller machine, but it is very noisy and doesn't work as well as the big one.

Trevor has been cutting some new slabs for members and for sale.

We could really do with a new Slab saw, preferably about a 23" but we need to save up for that one at around \$10,000.

The Agricultural Show is almost upon us and we have been busy making the usual preparations.

We did a huge order for Polished stones from WHW gems (around \$1,800) and put them in new 750ml boxes with some nice new labels which should last a lot longer than the old ones. Thanks to Bernadette, John H, Gail and Gary F,

We now have a superb collection for Sale which hopefully will last us through the year (or not)

Hopefully everyone will be available to be included on the roster for the 3 day show.

We did a 2 week Caravan trip at the start of May. Visiting Emerald, The Gem fiels, Longreach, Charleville and back through Roma etc.

A fossicking trip was organised for a day trip to Glenalva, about 20 k west of Sapphire. Didn't get much but it was good to learn how to do it properly.

Lyn has reported that the sites for the Gemfest are filling up fast, so we are expecting a really good show turnout.

As part of the improvements for the club, we have moved the 2 display Cabinets to give us a more open entry.

Matt Houston, who is Geologist, has done a fantastic job, taking all the specimens and rocks out of the cabinets and reorganising them into a proper categories. At the same time creating a spread sheet of names so we can make proper labels.

Susan Contini had originally put her hand up to do the job, but unfortunately she has not been well recently.

The big Blue...white Elephant', Rock lathe', which has been sitting on the bench, unused, for years. Has finally been sold. Thanks to 'Gumtree' A chap from Dalby thought he would have a use for it.

The Lapidary section has 2 diamond saws and 2 x 6wheel combination units for grinding and polishing.
