The NEW 24" Covington Saw

With a bit of a struggle, The New Saw Crate was unloaded from the Trailer.

Peter Kerr had previously fetched the saw from Glen Innes, and kept it at his place until we were ready.

All hands on were on deck to install it in the workshop.

Trevor, Ian, Andrew and John.

It is a fabulous machine, it looks well made and ready for work.

Since then, we have tried out the saw only to find the motor was quickly overheating. With a bit of negotiating with the supplier, we

had a new 2hp motor sent as a replacement for the 1.5hp motor. Since then it has been perfect and we look forward to cutting many more slabs from rocks we previously were not able to cut.

The Renovations: Polishers re-located and flooring installed



The 2 large polishing Units were moved through 90deg. In line with the existing central bench unit. Drains were taken across the floor (rather than dig the floor up). Moving the machines has got rid of a 'bottleneck' and given a nice access to the Saw room. The existing central workbench has had a facelift, moving the laps, polishing wheels, and creating a new dremel area.



Over \$1000 was spent on new 4mm rubber flooring. The results are terrific, (apart from the rubbery smell when you first open the doors). Its nice to walk on, easy to clean and has already saved the lives of several dropped stones. New floor taps have been installed for filling buckets and hose connections.

Preparation for the Gemfest started in earnest on the prior Thursday, getting tables and chairs in place, marking our for Traders, electrics, tents, brochures, fliers, Raffle, door prizes, fossicking cart kitchen etc. We had some great volunteers for both days before the show.
