

APCO Chapter Meeting Growth via Facebook Live

In Denver last year at the CCAM breakfast we heard a presentation from The North Carolina Chapter about their success using Facebook Live for meeting attendance. The presenter mentioned that initially there were reservations about live streaming as some members thought in person attendance would suffer. It didn't. As a matter of a fact, attendance grew.

I was intrigued and brought it to our Executive Board. We live streamed our first meeting in December of 2017. I had never done this before and my company was hosting the annual Holiday Meeting (the largest turnout of the year) and I was nervous! So, we streamed on the Indiana APCO site, Indiana NENA site and the Word Systems site just to be sure! There were about 80 people in person at the meeting, 71 views on the APCO page, 73 on the NENA page, and 54 on my company's page!!!!! Now, I know these numbers are inflated as lots of people were checking multiple pages.

We considered this a success and continued the practice at our quarterly meetings. The best "apples to apples" comparison I can give is from June 2017 versus June 2018. Those meetings were held in the same location in the northern part of our state. Each had 40 in physical attendance. The difference was that the 2018 meeting was streamed, and we reached 74 more people!

As I travel the state for work I always mention the meetings and the availability to watch online. The message is very well received, and many have been grateful as they don't have the budget for travel but can watch on their own schedule – or even live!

As we know 911 professionals often have an emergency and it is last minute. Streaming our meetings allows flexibility that is often needed in this industry as well as doing our best to serve our members.
