If you are going to be in the 11<sup>th</sup> grade, choose a book from the 11<sup>th</sup> / 12<sup>th</sup> list.  
If you are going to be in the 12<sup>th</sup> grade, choose a book from the 11<sup>th</sup> / 12<sup>th</sup> list.

#### Guidelines:

1. You are required to read one book from list 1 and one book from list 2.
2. Type your report. Use a 12 point, Times New Roman font. Double Space.
3. Page 1 – Title Page
