This historic private estate was formally part of the pre-Revolutionary War Van Cortlandt farm. The original house, dating back to the 1700s, remains. Careful renovations were made in the late 1800s to accommodate the Army Corp of Engineers when the Reservoir system was built. An early 1800s stone ice house, in pristine condition, once provided ice for Katonah. Ancient, meticulously maintained, vase-grafted apple trees stand; the vestige of what once was a large orchard. Specimen trees, bronze statuary, and an antique gazebo accent the many gardens. **Of particular note are the large formal perennials beds with dramatically planted urns, all carefully nurtured by Mary Larkin.** A century old wisteria drapes the dining pergola where most of the summer entertaining takes place. Last year we created a huge organic vegetable garden to provide an abundance of healthy eating. **2007** &
